Mr. MURPHY (for himself and Ms. SMITH) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To establish the Office of Social Connection Policy, to establish a national strategy on social connection, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Strategy for
5 Social Connection Act”.

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds the following:

8 (1) The health of the Nation is rightly meas-
9 ured not only by its aggregate wealth or global

1 power, but more centrally by its shared vision and
2 the bonds of connection that knit its people into a
3 community.

4 (2) The fraying of the social fabric is directly
5 implicated in the growth of loneliness, decline of
6 civic and religious participation, the disintegration of
7 communities, rising economic inequality and
8 precarity, falling economic mobility, rising rates of
9 depression, anxiety and addiction, diminishing health
10 and life expectancy and rising levels of polarization
11 and radicalization.

12 (3) These changes affect all people of the
13 United States, but fall with particular force on the
14 poor and marginalized, on children and adolescents,
15 on individuals residing in economically disadvan-
16 taged regions, on veterans and on the elderly, and
17 individuals without a college degree.

18 (4) The Surgeon General declared an epidemic
19 of loneliness and isolation on May 2, 2023.

20 (5) According to the Surgeon General, social
21 isolation and loneliness pose a significant risk to in-
22 dividual health and longevity, including a 29 percent
23 increased risk of heart disease, a 32 percent in-
24 creased risk of stroke, and for older adults, a 50
25 percent increased risk of developing dementia.

(6) Loneliness and social isolation increase the risk for premature death by 26 percent and 29 percent, respectively.

4 (7) The general flourishing, economic health
5 and stability of the United States, and the effective
6 functioning of government and society require re-
7 newed attention to social connection at every level of
8 society, from individual and family, to local commu-
9 nity and Nation.

3 **SEC. 3. OFFICE OF SOCIAL CONNECTION POLICY; NA-**
4 **TIONAL STRATEGY ON SOCIAL CONNECTION.**

5 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

6 (1) ADVISORY COUNCIL.—The term “Advisory
7 Council” means the advisory council established
8 under subsection (c)(1).

9 (2) DIRECTOR.—The term “Director” means
10 the Director of the Office.

11 (3) INADEQUATE.—The term “inadequate”,
12 with respect to loneliness, means the discrepancy or
13 unmet need between an individual’s or community’s
14 preferred and actual experience.

15 (4) LONELINESS.—The term “loneliness”, with
16 respect to an individual, means a subjective dis-
17 tressing experience of an individual that results from
18 perceived isolation or inadequate meaningful connec-
19 tion.

20 (5) OFFICE.—The term “Office” means the Of-
21 fice of Social Connection Policy.

22 (6) SOCIAL CONNECTEDNESS.—The term “so-
23 cial connectedness” means the degree to which an
24 individual or community achieves and maintains so-
25 cial connection needs.

1 (7) SOCIAL CONNECTION.—The term “social
2 connection” means a continuum of the size and di-
3 versity of an individual’s social network and roles,
4 the functions such relationships and roles serve, and
5 the positive or negative qualities of such relation-
6 ships and roles.

7 (8) SOCIAL DISCONNECTION.—The term “social
8 disconnection” means objective or subjective deficits
9 in social connection, including deficits in social rela-
10 tionships and roles, the functions such relationships
11 and roles serve, and the positive or negative qualities
12 of such relationships and roles.

13 (9) SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE.—The term “so-
14 cial infrastructure” means the programs (such as
15 volunteer organizations, sports groups, religious
16 groups, and member associations), policies (such as
17 public transportation, housing, and education), and
18 physical elements (such as libraries, parks, green
19 spaces, and playgrounds) of a community that sup-
20 port the development of social connection.

21 (10) SOCIAL ISOLATION.—The term “social iso-
22 lation”, with respect to an individual, means that
23 the individual objectively has few social relation-
24 ships, social roles, or group memberships and has in-
25 frequent social interaction.

1 (b) OFFICE OF SOCIAL CONNECTION POLICY.—

2 (1) IN GENERAL.—There is established within
3 the Executive Office of the President an office, to be
4 known as the “Office of Social Connection Policy”.

5 (2) PURPOSES.—The purposes of the Office
6 shall be to provide to the President independent, ex-
7 pert judgment and assistance on policy matters that
8 require accurate assessments of social connection.

9 (3) DIRECTOR.—

10 (A) IN GENERAL.—The head of the Office
11 shall be the Director, who shall be appointed by
12 the President, by and with the advice and con-
13 sent of the Senate.

14 (B) COMPENSATION.—The Director shall
15 be compensated at the rate provided for level IV
16 of the Executive Schedule under section 5315
17 of title 5, United States Code.

18 (4) ASSOCIATE DIRECTORS.—

19 (A) IN GENERAL.—The President may ap-
20 point, by and with the advice and consent of the
21 Senate, not more than 4 Associate Directors of
22 the Office.

23 (B) COMPENSATION.—An Associate Direc-
24 tor appointed under subparagraph (A) shall be
25 compensated at the rate provided for level V of

1 the Executive Schedule under section 5316 of
2 title 5, United States Code.

3 (5) DUTIES.—

4 (A) IN GENERAL.—The Director shall—

5 (i) advise the President on timely and
6 authoritative research regarding public
7 health, technological, and social infrastruc-
8 ture aspects of social connection and loneli-
9 ness that require attention at the highest
10 levels of the Federal Government;

11 (ii) advise the President on social con-
12 nection and loneliness considerations with
13 respect to issues of national concern, in-
14 cluding the economy, public health, na-
15 tional security, the environment, and civic
16 and community engagement;

17 (iii) with respect to research and de-
18 velopment relating to social connection and
19 loneliness—

20 (I) assist the Director of the Of-
21 fice of Management and Budget with
22 an annual review and analysis of
23 funding proposed for such research
24 and development for all Federal agen-
25 cies; and

(II) assist the Director of the Of-

fice of Management and Budget and

process;

(iv) assist the President in providing

(v) provide prompt, effective, reliable,

NATIONAL STRATEGY.—

(i) IN GENERAL.—The Office shall es-

ish, maintain, and periodically update

integrated national strategy to improve

1 social connection, ameliorate loneliness,
2 and slow or stop the progression of social
3 disconnection.

4 (ii) REQUIREMENT.—The national
5 strategy under clause (i) shall be an inclu-
6 sive, Federal Government-wide approach
7 that leverages existing Federal resources
8 and authorities to achieve enhanced social
9 connection.

10 (c) ADVISORY COUNCIL.—

11 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
12 the date of enactment of this Act, the Director shall
13 establish an intergovernmental advisory council the
14 purpose of which shall be to address loneliness, so-
15 cial disconnection, and social connection experienced
16 by individuals in the United States.

17 (2) ACTIVITIES.—The Advisory Council shall—

18 (A) carry out an annual assessment on so-
19 cial connection in accordance with paragraph
20 (5);

21 (B) provide information on, and coordi-
22 nate, social connection research and services
23 across all Federal agencies;

24 (C) encourage the development of effective
25 strategies and approaches to prevent social dis-

1 connection and improve social infrastructure,
2 quality of life, and community;

3 (D) review the impact of social disconnec-
4 tion and loneliness on physical, mental, and so-
5 cial health;

6 (E) to the maximum extent practicable, co-
7 ordinate with international bodies to integrate
8 and inform the global mission to improve social
9 connection;

10 (F) advise the Director;

11 (G) issue national guidelines on social con-
12 nection; and

13 (H) carry out such other activities as the
14 Director determines appropriate.

15 (3) MEMBERSHIP.—

16 (A) COMPOSITION.—The Advisory Council
17 shall be composed of—

18 (i) the Director (or the Director's des-
19 ignee), who shall serve as the Chair of the
20 Advisory Council;

21 (ii) the Federal members under sub-
22 paragraph (B); and

23 (iii) the non-Federal members under
24 subparagraph (C).

25 (B) FEDERAL MEMBERS.—

(I) the Department of Commerce;

 - (xi) 1 or more representatives of non-profit organizations that advocate for youth and have youth serving on their boards or in leadership positions;
 - (xii) 1 or more representatives of community action agencies;

5 (4) MEETINGS.—

(A) QUARTERLY MEETINGS.—The Advisory Council shall meet not less frequently than quarterly, and at the call of the Director.

(iv) to establish and scale community connection programs;

(v) to coordinate public health campaigns that raise awareness and reduce the stigma surrounding loneliness;

(vi) to strengthen measurement practices to increase collection of data measuring loneliness and social connection;

(viii) to support youth participation in strategies to improve social connection and community connection; and

(B) an assessment of other issues the Director determines appropriate.

(6) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than 18 months after the date of enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the Advisory Council shall sub-

1 mit to the Director and Congress a report that de-
2 scribes—

10 (C) an evaluation of the implementation,
11 including outcomes, of the national strategy de-
12 scribed in subsection (b)(5)(B).

13 (d) DATA SHARING.—Each Federal agency that has
14 data relating to loneliness and social connection shall
15 share such data with the Director and make such data
16 publicly available, subject to applicable Federal law relat-
17 ing to disclosure of such data, to enable the Advisory
18 Council to complete the reports described in subsection
19 (c)(6).

20 (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
21 authorized to be appropriated to the Centers for Disease
22 Control and Prevention \$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years
23 2024 through 2029 to conduct or support research on
24 loneliness and social connection.
