Mr. CARDIN (for himself, Ms. COLLINS, Mr. CASEY, and Mr. HELLER) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to repeal the Medicare outpatient rehabilitation therapy caps.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Medicare Access to
5 Rehabilitation Services Act of 2017”.

6 **SEC. 2. OUTPATIENT THERAPY CAP REPEAL.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1833 of the Social Secu-
8 rity Act (42 U.S.C. 1395(l)) is amended by striking sub-
9 section (g).

1 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section
2 1842(t)(2) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
3 1395u(t)(2)) is amended—

4 (1) by striking “(2) Each request” and all that
5 follows through “1833(a)(8)(B),” and inserting
6 “(2)(A) Each request for payment, or bill submitted,
7 for therapy services described in subparagraph (B)”;
8 and

9 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
10 paragraph:

11 “(B) The following therapy services are described in
12 this subparagraph:

13 “(i) Physical therapy services of the type de-
14 scribed in section 1861(p) and speech-language pa-
15 thology services of the type described in such section
16 through the application of section 1861(l)(2), in-
17 cluding services described in section 1833(a)(8)(B),
18 and physical therapy services and speech-language
19 pathology services of such type which are furnished
20 by a physician or as incident to physicians’ services.

21 “(ii) Occupational therapy services of the type
22 that are described in section 1861(p), including serv-
23 ices described in section 1833(a)(8)(B), through the
24 operation of section 1861(g) and of such type which

1 are furnished by a physician or as incident to physi-
2 cians' services.”.

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
