A BILL

To prohibit the Administrator of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration from issuing a rule or promulgating a regulation requiring certain vehicles to be equipped with speed limiting devices, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Deregulating Restriction-
5 tions on Interstate Vehicles and Eighteen-wheelers Act”
6 or the “DRIVE Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON REQUIRING SPEED LIMITING DE-**
2 **VICES.**

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Ad-
4 ministrator of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Adminis-
5 tration may not issue any rule or promulgate any regula-
6 tion to require vehicles with a gross vehicle weight of more
7 than 26,000 pounds operating in interstate commerce to
8 be equipped with a speed limiting device set to a maximum
9 speed.
