- To assist Tribal governments in the management of buffalo and buffalo habitat and the reestablishment of buffalo on Indian land.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Indian Buffalo Man-3 agement Act".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS; PURPOSES.

5 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

6 (1) buffalo sustained a majority of Indian
7 Tribes in North America for many centuries before
8 buffalo were nearly exterminated by non-Indian
9 hunters in the mid-1800s;

10 (2) the historical, cultural, and spiritual connec11 tion between buffalo and Indian Tribes has not di12 minished over time;

(3) Indian Tribes have long desired the reestablishment of buffalo throughout Indian country for
cultural, spiritual, and subsistence purposes; and

16 (4) the successful restoration of buffalo would17 allow an Indian Tribe to benefit from—

18 (A) the reintroduction of buffalo into the19 diets of the members of the Indian Tribe;

20 (B) the rekindling of the spiritual and cul21 tural relationship between buffalo and the In22 dian Tribe; and

(C) the use of buffalo for economic development, in the case of an Indian Tribe that
chooses to use buffalo for economic development.

(b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are—	-
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2 (1) to fulfill the government-to-government rela3 tionship between Tribal governments and the United
4 States in the management of buffalo and buffalo
5 habitat;

6 (2) to promote and develop the capacity of In7 dian Tribes and Tribal organizations to manage buf8 falo and buffalo habitat;

9 (3) to protect, conserve, and enhance buffalo,
10 which are important to the subsistence, culture, and
11 economic development of many Indian Tribes;

(4) to promote the development and use of buffalo and buffalo habitat for the maximum practicable benefit of Indian Tribes and Tribal organizations, through management of buffalo and buffalo
habitats in accordance with integrated resource
management plans developed by Indian Tribes and
Tribal organizations;

19 (5) to develop buffalo herds and increase pro20 duction of buffalo in order to meet Tribal subsist21 ence, health, cultural, and economic development
22 needs; and

(6) to promote the inclusion of Indian Tribes
and Tribal organizations in Department of the Interior, local, regional, national, or international—

1	(A) decision-making processes; and
2	(B) forums.
3	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
4	In this Act:
5	(1) BUFFALO.—The term "buffalo" means an
6	animal of the subspecies Bison bison bison.
7	(2) BUFFALO HABITAT.—The term "buffalo
8	habitat" means Indian land that is managed for buf-
9	falo.
10	(3) DEPARTMENT.—The term "Department"
11	means the Department of the Interior.
12	(4) INDIAN LAND.—The term "Indian land"
13	has the meaning given the term in paragraph (2) of
14	section 2601 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (25
15	U.S.C. 3501), except that, in that paragraph, the
16	term "Indian reservation" shall be considered to
17	have the meaning given the term "Indian reserva-
18	tion" in paragraph (3) of that section, without re-
19	gard to the date specified in paragraph (3) of that
20	section.
21	(5) INDIAN TRIBE.—The term "Indian Tribe"
22	has the meaning given the term in section 4 of the
23	Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance
24	Act (25 U.S.C. 5304).

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1	(6) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
2	the Secretary of the Interior.
3	(7) TRIBAL ORGANIZATION.—The term "Tribal
4	organization" means any legally established organi-
5	zation of Indians that—
6	(A)(i) is chartered under section 17 of the
7	Act of June 18, 1934, (commonly known as the
8	"Indian Reorganization Act"; 25 U.S.C. 5124)
9	and recognized by the governing body of one or
10	more Indian Tribes; or
11	(ii) is a Tribal corporation federally char-
12	tered under section 3 of the Oklahoma Indian
13	Welfare Act (25 U.S.C. 5203); and
14	(B) has demonstrable experience in the
15	restoration of buffalo and buffalo habitat on In-
16	dian land.
17	SEC. 4. BUFFALO RESOURCE MANAGEMENT.
18	(a) Program Established.—The Secretary shall
19	establish a permanent program within the Department for
20	the purposes of—
21	(1) promoting and developing the capacity of
22	Indian Tribes and Tribal organizations to manage
23	buffalo and buffalo habitat;
24	(2) promoting the ability of Indian Tribes and
25	Tribal organizations to protect, conserve, and en-

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hance populations of buffalo that are owned by In-
dian Tribes or Tribal organizations;
(3) promoting the development and use of buf-
falo and buffalo habitat for the maximum prac-
ticable benefit of Indian Tribes and Tribal organiza-
tions; and
(4) promoting the inclusion of Indian Tribes
and Tribal organizations in Department, inter-
national, national, regional, and local decision mak-
ing and forums regarding buffalo and buffalo habi-
tat.
(b) Contracts and Grants Authorized.—
(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall enter
into contracts and cooperative agreements with, and
award grants to, Indian Tribes and Tribal organiza-
tions to enable the Indian Tribes and Tribal organi-
zations—
(A) to plan, conduct, or implement a buf-
falo restoration or management program;
(B) to plan and execute commercial activi-
ties related to buffalo or buffalo products;
(C) to support the use and deployment of
mobile Tribal or Tribal organization meat proc-
essing facilities; or

1 (D) to carry out other activities relating to 2 buffalo restoration and management. 3 (2) NO DIMINISHMENT OF LAWS AND REGULA-4 TIONS.—Nothing in this subsection diminishes any 5 Federal or State law (including regulations) regard-6 ing diseased buffalo or buffalo that escape from In-7 dian land. 8 (c) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.—The Secretary shall 9 provide technical assistance to an Indian Tribe or Tribal

10 organization that enters into a contract or cooperative
11 agreement or receives a grant under this section to assist
12 the Indian Tribe or Tribal organization in—

13 (1) carrying out the activities of a buffalo or
14 buffalo habitat restoration or management program;
15 and

16 (2) implementing the activities described in sub-17 paragraphs (A) through (D) of subsection (b)(1).

18 SEC. 5. CONSULTATION; COORDINATION.

(a) CONSULTATION.—Not later than 1 year after the
date of enactment of this Act, and on an ongoing basis
thereafter, the Secretary shall consult with Indian Tribes
and Tribal organizations on initiatives of the Department
that affect buffalo or buffalo habitat, including efforts of
the Department to contain or eradicate diseased buffalo.

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(b) COORDINATION.—The Secretary shall develop a
 policy relating to buffalo and buffalo habitat management
 activities on Indian land, in accordance with—

4 (1) the goals and objectives described in buffalo
5 management programs approved by Indian Tribes;
6 and

7 (2) Tribal laws and ordinances.

8 SEC. 6. PROTECTION OF INFORMATION.

9 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Sec-10 retary shall not disclose or cause to be disclosed any infor-11 mation provided to the Secretary by an Indian Tribe or 12 Tribal organization that is identified by the Indian Tribe 13 or Tribal organization as culturally sensitive, proprietary, 14 or otherwise confidential.

15 SEC. 7. BUFFALO FROM FEDERAL LAND.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may enter into an
agreement with an Indian Tribe or Tribal organization to
dispose of surplus buffalo on Federal land administered
by the Department, as applicable, by transporting such
buffalo onto Indian land.

(b) APPLICATION.—An Indian Tribe or Tribal organization may submit to the Secretary an application to receive buffalo described in subsection (a) at such time, in
such manner, and containing such information as the Secretary may require.

(c) WAIVER OF CHARGES.—The Secretary may waive
 any charges for the buffalo described in subsection (a),
 including any deposit or payment for services as described
 in section 10.2 of title 36, Code of Federal Regulations
 (or any successor regulation).

6 SEC. 8. TREATY RIGHTS RETAINED.

7 Nothing in this Act alters, modifies, diminishes, or8 extinguishes the treaty rights of any Indian Tribe.

9 SEC. 9. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

There is authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to carry out this Act \$14,000,000 for fiscal year
2024 and each fiscal year thereafter.

13 SEC. 10. SUNSET.

14 The authority provided by this Act ceases to be effec-

15 tive on December 31, 2031.
