# A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish in the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency the National Cyber Exercise Program, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1   **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       This Act may be cited as the “CISA Cyber Exercise  
3   Act”.

4   **SEC. 2. NATIONAL CYBER EXERCISE PROGRAM.**

5       (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Subtitle A of title XXII of the  
6   Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 651 et seq.)  
7   is amended by adding at the end the following new section:

8   **“SEC. 2220A. NATIONAL CYBER EXERCISE PROGRAM.**

9       “(a) **ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM.**—

10       “(1) **IN GENERAL.**—There is established in the  
11   Agency the National Cyber Exercise Program (re-  
12   ferred to in this section as the ‘Exercise Program’)  
13   to evaluate the National Cyber Incident Response  
14   Plan, and other related plans and strategies.

15       “(2) **REQUIREMENTS.**—

16       “(A) **IN GENERAL.**—The Exercise Program  
17   shall be—

18               “(i) based on current risk assess-  
19   ments, including credible threats,  
20   vulnerabilities, and consequences;

21               “(ii) designed, to the extent practi-  
22   cable, to simulate the partial or complete  
23   incapacitation of a government or critical  
24   infrastructure network resulting from a  
25   cyber incident;

1           “(iii) designed to provide for the sys-  
2           tematic evaluation of cyber readiness and  
3           enhance operational understanding of the  
4           cyber incident response system and rel-  
5           evant information sharing agreements; and

6           “(iv) designed to promptly develop  
7           after-action reports and plans that can  
8           quickly incorporate lessons learned into fu-  
9           ture operations.

10          “(B) MODEL EXERCISE SELECTION.—The  
11          Exercise Program shall—

12           “(i) include a selection of model exer-  
13           cises that government and private entities  
14           can readily adapt for use; and

15           “(ii) aid such governments and pri-  
16           vate entities with the design, implemen-  
17           tation, and evaluation of exercises that—

18              “(I) conform to the requirements  
19              described in subparagraph (A);

20              “(II) are consistent with any ap-  
21              plicable national, State, local, or Trib-  
22              al strategy or plan; and

23              “(III) provide for systematic  
24              evaluation of readiness.

1           “(3) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out the Ex-  
2 ercise Program, the Director may consult with ap-  
3 propriate representatives from Sector Risk Manage-  
4 ment Agencies, the Office of the National Cyber Di-  
5 rector, cybersecurity research stakeholders, and See-  
6 tor Coordinating Councils.

7           “(b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

8           “(1) STATE.—The term ‘State’ means any  
9 State of the United States, the District of Columbia,  
10 the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Northern  
11 Mariana Islands, the United States Virgin Islands,  
12 Guam, American Samoa, and any other territory or  
13 possession of the United States.

14           “(2) PRIVATE ENTITY.—The term ‘private enti-  
15 ty’ has the meaning given such term in section 102  
16 of the Cybersecurity Information Sharing Act of  
17 2015 (6 U.S.C. 1501).”.

18           (b) TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS.—

19           (1) HOMELAND SECURITY ACT OF 2002.—Sub-  
20 title A of title XXII of the Homeland Security Act  
21 of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 651 et seq.) is amended—

22                 (A) in the first section 2215 (6 U.S.C.  
23 665; relating to the duties and authorities relat-  
24 ing to .gov internet domain), by amending the

1           section enumerator and heading to read as fol-  
2           lows:

3   **“SEC. 2215. DUTIES AND AUTHORITIES RELATING TO .GOV  
4           INTERNET DOMAIN.”;**

5           (B) in the second section 2215 (6 U.S.C.  
6           665b; relating to the joint cyber planning of-  
7           fice), by amending the section enumerator and  
8           heading to read as follows:

9   **“SEC. 2216. JOINT CYBER PLANNING OFFICE.”;**

10          (C) in the third section 2215 (6 U.S.C.  
11          665c; relating to the Cybersecurity State Coor-  
12          dinator), by amending the section enumerator  
13          and heading to read as follows:

14   **“SEC. 2217. CYBERSECURITY STATE COORDINATOR.”;**

15          (D) in the fourth section 2215 (6 U.S.C.  
16          665d; relating to Sector Risk Management  
17          Agencies), by amending the section enumerator  
18          and heading to read as follows:

19   **“SEC. 2218. SECTOR RISK MANAGEMENT AGENCIES.”;**

20          (E) in section 2216 (6 U.S.C. 665e; relat-  
21          ing to the Cybersecurity Advisory Committee),  
22          by amending the section enumerator and head-  
23          ing to read as follows:

24   **“SEC. 2219. CYBERSECURITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE.”;**

25          and

13       (e) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents  
14 in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is  
15 amended by striking the items relating to sections 2214  
16 through 2217 and inserting the following new items:

"See: 2214. National Asset Database."

"See: 2215. Duties and authorities relating to .gov internet domain."

14 and evaluation of exercises that—

15                   “(I) conform to the requirements  
16 described in subparagraph (A);

17                   “(II) are consistent with any ap-  
18 plicable national, State, local, or Trib-  
19 al strategy or plan; and

20                   “(III) provide for systematic eval-  
21 uation of readiness.

22                   “(3) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out the Exer-  
23 cise Program, the Director may consult with appro-  
24 priate representatives from Sector Risk Management  
25 Agencies, the Office of the National Cyber Director,

1       *cybersecurity research stakeholders, and Sector Co-*  
2       *ordinating Councils.*

3       “(b) *DEFINITIONS.*—*In this section:*

4           “(1) *STATE.*—*The term ‘State’ means any State*  
5       *of the United States, the District of Columbia, the*  
6       *Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Northern Mariana*  
7       *Islands, the United States Virgin Islands, Guam,*  
8       *American Samoa, and any other territory or posses-*  
9       *sion of the United States.*

10          “(2) *PRIVATE ENTITY.*—*The term ‘private entity’*  
11       *has the meaning given such term in section 102 of the*  
12       *Cybersecurity Information Sharing Act of 2015 (6*  
13       *U.S.C. 1501).*

14          “(c) *RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.*—*Nothing in this sec-*  
15       *tion shall be construed to affect the authority or responsibil-*  
16       *ties of the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Man-*  
17       *agement Agency pursuant to section 648 of the Post-*  
18       *Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of 2006 (6*  
19       *U.S.C. 748).*”.

20          (b) *CLERICAL AMENDMENT.*—*The table of contents in*  
21       *section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is*  
22       *amended by inserting after the item relating to section 2217*  
23       *the following:*

“Sec. 2220A. *National Cyber Exercise Program.*”.
