Mr. TESTER (for himself and Mr. MORAN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To authorize major medical facility projects for the Department of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 2023, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Fiscal Year 2023 Vet-
5 erans Affairs Major Medical Facility Authorization Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF MAJOR MEDICAL FACILITY**
7 **PROJECTS OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS**
8 **AFFAIRS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023.**

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
10 may carry out the following major medical facility projects

1 in fiscal year 2023 at the locations specified and in an
2 amount for each project not to exceed the amount speci-
3 fied for such location:

4 (1) Construction of a community-based out-
5 patient clinic and national cemetery in Alameda,
6 California, in an amount not to exceed
7 \$395,000,000.

8 (2) Construction of a community living center
9 and renovation of domiciliary and outpatient facili-
10 ties in Canandaigua, New York, in an amount not
11 to exceed \$506,400,000.

12 (3) Construction of a new health care center in
13 El Paso, Texas, in an amount not to exceed
14 \$700,000,000.

15 (4) Seismic upgrade and specialty care improve-
16 ments in Fort Harrison, Montana, in an amount not
17 to exceed \$88,600,000.

18 (5) Realignment and closure of the Livermore
19 campus in Livermore, California, in an amount not
20 to exceed \$490,000,000.

21 (6) Construction of a new medical facility in
22 Louisville, Kentucky, in an amount not to exceed
23 \$1,013,000,000.

1 (7) Seismic retrofit and renovation of buildings
2 100 and 101 in Portland, Oregon, in an amount not
3 to exceed \$523,000,000.

4 (8) Replacement of the VA Sierra Nevada
5 Health Care System Medical Center in Reno, Ne-
6 vada, in an amount not to exceed \$223,800,000.

7 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
8 authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary of Veterans
9 Affairs for fiscal year 2023 or the year in which funds
10 are appropriated for the Construction, Major Projects ac-
11 count, \$3,939,800,000 for the projects authorized in sub-
12 section (a).

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
