To require the Secretary of Agriculture to establish a grant program to address forestry workforce development needs, and for other purposes.

Mr. KING (for himself, Mr. RISCH, Mr. GRAHAM, Mr. CRAPO, Ms. KLOBUCHAR, Mr. MERKLEY, and Mrs. SHAHEEN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry

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## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to establish a grant program to address forestry workforce development needs, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Jobs in the Woods  
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FORESTRY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT GRANTS.**

7       (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

8              (1) CAREER PATHWAY.—The term “career  
9 pathway” has the meaning given the term in section

1       3 of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act  
2       (29 U.S.C. 3102).

3                     (2) ELIGIBLE AREA.—The term “eligible area”  
4       means an area that—

5                         (A) is a nonmetropolitan area that qualifi-  
6        fies as a low-income community (as defined in  
7        section 45D(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of  
8        1986);

9                         (B) has access to or has a plan to achieve  
10      broadband service with—

11                             (i) at least 100 Mbps download and  
12      20 Mbps upload speeds;

13                             (ii) latency sufficiently low for real-  
14      time, interactive applications; and

15                             (iii) network reliability of not more  
16      than 48 hours of outage time over any  
17      365-day period; and

18                         (C) has a population of 20,000 or fewer in-  
19      habitants.

20                         (3) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term “eligible enti-  
21      ty” means—

22                             (A) a nonprofit organization;

23                             (B) a State;

24                             (C) an Indian Tribe;

25                             (D) a unit of local government; and

1                             (E) an institution of higher education (as  
2                             defined in section 101 of the Higher Education  
3                             Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001)).

4                             (4) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
5                             the Secretary of Agriculture.

6                             (b) ESTABLISHMENT.—Not later than 1 year after  
7                             the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall es-  
8                             tablish a competitive grant program to make grants to eli-  
9                             gible entities to carry out career pathway training pro-  
10                             grams in eligible areas with respect to forestry operations  
11                             and forestry products industries.

12                             (c) APPLICATIONS.—

13                             (1) IN GENERAL.—To be eligible to receive a  
14                             grant under this section, an eligible entity shall sub-  
15                             mit to the Secretary an application at such time, in  
16                             such manner, and containing such information as  
17                             the Secretary may require, which shall include—

18                                 (A) a demonstrated capacity to carry out a  
19                             career pathway training program in accordance  
20                             with subsection (b);

21                                 (B) a demonstration of need for such pro-  
22                             gram within a region;

23                                 (C) a projection of the extent of reach in-  
24                             tended for such program;

1                         (D) a plan to ensure that such program is  
2                         sustainable; and

3                         (E) a plan for the implementation of such  
4                         program.

5                         (2) PRIORITY.—In awarding grants under this  
6                         section, the Secretary shall give priority to eligible  
7                         entities that—

8                         (A) propose to carry out activities to ad-  
9                         dress the issues of an aging workforce and  
10                         youth migration;

11                         (B) will partner with secondary schools (as  
12                         defined in section 8101 of the Elementary and  
13                         Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.  
14                         7801)) to engage students; and

15                         (C) demonstrate the ability to assist with  
16                         forestry workforce placement and hiring.

17                         (d) TERM; AMOUNT.—A grant made under this sec-  
18                         tion shall be—

19                         (1) for a period of not more than 4 years; and

20                         (2) in an amount that is—

21                         (A) not less than \$500,000; and

22                         (B) not more than \$2,000,000.

1       (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is  
2 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section  
3 \$10,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2024 through 2028.
