A BILL

To provide for a biennial budget process and a biennial appropriations process and to enhance oversight and the performance of the Federal Government.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Biennial Budgeting
5 and Appropriations Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REVISION OF TIMETABLE.**

7 Section 300 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974
8 (2 U.S.C. 631) is amended to read as follows:

1 “TIMETABLE

2 “SEC. 300. (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided by
 3 subsection (b), the timetable with respect to the congres-
 4 sional budget process for any Congress (beginning with
 5 the One Hundred Nineteenth Congress) is as follows:

“First Session

On or before:	Action to be completed:
First Monday in February	President submits budget recommendations.
February 15	Congressional Budget Office submits report to Budget Committees.
Not later than 6 weeks after budget submission.	Committees submit views and estimates to Budget Committees.
April 1	Budget Committees report concurrent resolution on the biennial budget.
May 15	Congress completes action on concurrent resolution on the biennial budget.
May 15	Biennial appropriation bills may be considered in the House.
June 10	House Appropriations Committee reports last biennial appropriation bill.
June 30	House completes action on biennial appropriation bills.
August 1	Congress completes action on reconciliation legislation.
October 1	Biennium begins.

“Second Session

On or before:	Action to be completed:
February 15	President submits budget review.
Not later than 6 weeks after President submits budget review.	Congressional Budget Office submits report to Budget Committees.
The last day of the session	Congress completes action on bills and resolutions authorizing new budget authority for the succeeding biennium.

6 “(b) SPECIAL RULE.—In the case of any first session
 7 of Congress that begins in any year immediately following
 8 a leap year and during which the term of a President (ex-
 9 cept a President who succeeds himself or herself) begins,

1 the following dates shall supersede those set forth in sub-
 2 section (a):

“First Session	
On or before:	Action to be completed:
First Monday in April	President submits budget recommendations.
April 20	Committees submit views and estimates to Budget Committees.
May 15	Budget Committees report concurrent resolution on the biennial budget.
June 1	Congress completes action on concurrent resolution on the biennial budget.

July 20	House completes action on biennial appropriation bills.
August 1	Congress completes action on reconciliation legislation.
October 1	Biennium begins.”.

3 **SEC. 3. AMENDMENTS TO THE CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET**
 4 **AND IMPOUNDMENT CONTROL ACT OF 1974.**

5 (a) DECLARATION OF PURPOSE.—Section 2(2) of the
 6 Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of
 7 1974 (2 U.S.C. 621(2)) is amended by striking “each
 8 year” and inserting “biennially”.

9 (b) DEFINITIONS.—

10 (1) BUDGET RESOLUTION.—Section 3(4) of
 11 such Act (2 U.S.C. 622(4)) is amended by striking
 12 “fiscal year” each place it appears and inserting “bi-
 13 ennium”.

14 (2) BIENNIUM.—Section 3 of such Act (2
 15 U.S.C. 622) is further amended by adding at the
 16 end the following new paragraph:

1 “(12) The term ‘biennium’ means the period of
2 2 consecutive fiscal years beginning on October 1 of
3 any odd-numbered year.”.

17 on October 1 of such year” the first place
18 it appears and inserting “the biennium be-
19 ginning on October 1 of such year”; and

20 (iii) striking “the fiscal year beginning
21 on October 1 of such year” the second
22 place it appears and inserting “each fiscal
23 year in such period”;

1 (B) in paragraph (6), by striking “for the
2 fiscal year” and inserting “for each fiscal year
3 in the biennium”; and

4 (C) in paragraph (7), by striking “for the
5 fiscal year” and inserting “for each fiscal year
6 in the biennium”.

2 October 1 of that year.”.

13 **SEC. 5. TWO-YEAR APPROPRIATIONS; TITLE AND STYLE OF**
 14 **APPROPRIATIONS ACTS.**

15 Section 105 of title 1, United States Code, is amend-
 16 ed to read as follows:

17 **“§ 105. Title and style of appropriations Acts**

18 “(a) The style and title of all Acts making appropria-
 19 tions for the support of the Government shall be as fol-
 20 lows: ‘An Act making appropriations (here insert the ob-
 21 ject) for each fiscal year in the biennium of fiscal years
 22 (here insert the fiscal years of the biennium).’.

23 “(b) All Acts making regular appropriations for the
 24 support of the Government shall be enacted for a biennium

1 and shall specify the amount of appropriations provided
 2 for each fiscal year in such period.

3 “(c) For purposes of this section, the term ‘biennium’
 4 has the same meaning as in section 3(12) of the Congres-
 5 sional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 (2
 6 U.S.C. 622(12)).”.

7 **SEC. 6. MULTIYEAR AUTHORIZATIONS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title III of the Congressional
 9 Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 631 et seq.) is amended
 10 by adding at the end the following:

11 “AUTHORIZATIONS OF APPROPRIATIONS

12 “SEC. 316. (a) POINT OF ORDER.—It shall not be
 13 in order in the House of Representatives or the Senate
 14 to consider—

15 “(1) any bill, joint resolution, amendment, mo-
 16 tion, amendment between the Houses, or conference
 17 report that authorizes appropriations for a period of
 18 less than 2 fiscal years, unless the program, project,
 19 or activity for which the appropriations are author-
 20 ized will require no further appropriations and will
 21 be completed or terminated after the appropriations
 22 have been expended; and

23 “(2) in any odd-numbered year, any authoriza-
 24 tion or revenue bill or joint resolution until Congress
 25 completes action on the biennial budget resolution,

1 all regular biennial appropriations bills, and all rec-
2 onciliation bills.

3 “(b) APPLICABILITY.—In the Senate, subsection (a)
4 shall not apply to—

5 “(1) any measure that is privileged for consid-
6 eration pursuant to a rule or statute;

7 “(2) any matter considered in Executive Ses-
8 sion; or

9 “(3) an appropriations measure or reconcili-
10 ation bill.”.

11 (b) AMENDMENT TO TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The
12 table of contents in section 1(b) of the Congressional
13 Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is amend-
14 ed by inserting after the item relating to section 315 the
15 following:

“Sec. 316. Authorizations of appropriations.”.

16 **SEC. 7. GOVERNMENT PLANS ON A BIENNIAL BASIS.**

17 (a) MANAGERIAL ACCOUNTABILITY AND FLEXI-
18 BILITY.—Section 9703 of title 31, United States Code, re-
19 lating to managerial accountability, is amended—

20 (1) in subsection (a)—

21 (A) in the first sentence by striking “an-
22 nual”; and

23 (B) by striking “section 1105(a)(29)” and
24 inserting “section 1105(a)(28)”; and

25 (2) in subsection (e)—

1 (A) in the first sentence by striking “one
2 or”;

3 (B) in the second sentence by striking “a
4 subsequent year” and inserting “a subsequent
5 2-year period”; and

6 (C) in the third sentence by striking
7 “three” and inserting “4”.

8 (b) PILOT PROJECTS FOR PERFORMANCE BUDG-
9 ETING.—Section 1119 of title 31, United States Code, is
10 amended—

11 (1) in subsection (d)(1), by striking “annual”
12 and inserting “biennial”; and

13 (2) in subsection (e), by striking “annual” and
14 inserting “biennial”.

15 (c) STRATEGIC PLANS.—Section 2802 of title 39,
16 United States Code, is amended—

17 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “September
18 30, 1997” and inserting “September 30, 2025”;

19 (2) in subsection (b)—

20 (A) by striking “five years forward” and
21 inserting “6 years forward”; and

22 (B) by striking “at least every three years”
23 and inserting “at least every 4 years”; and

24 (3) in subsection (c), by striking “section” the
25 second place it appears and inserting “section, in-

1 including a strategic plan submitted by September 30,
2 2025, meeting the requirements of subsection (a)”.

3 (d) PERFORMANCE PLANS.—Section 2803(a) of title
4 39, United States Code, is amended—

5 (1) in the matter preceding paragraph (1), by
6 striking “an annual” and inserting “a biennial”;

7 (2) in paragraph (1), by inserting “for each fis-
8 cal year during the biennial period” after “program
9 activity”;

10 (3) in paragraph (5), by striking “and” after
11 the semicolon;

12 (4) in paragraph (6), by striking the period and
13 inserting “; and”; and

14 (5) by adding after paragraph (6) the following:

15 “(7) cover a 2-year period beginning with the
16 first fiscal year of the next biennial budget cycle.”.

17 (e) COMMITTEE VIEWS OF PLANS AND REPORTS.—

18 Section 301(d) of the Congressional Budget Act (2 U.S.C.

19 632(d)) is amended by adding at the end “Each committee

20 of the Senate or the House of Representatives shall review

21 the strategic plans, performance plans, and performance

22 reports, required under section 306 of title 5, United

23 States Code, and sections 1115 and 1116 of title 31,

24 United States Code, of all agencies under the jurisdiction

25 of the committee. Each committee may provide its views

1 on such plans or reports to the Committee on the Budget
2 of the applicable House.”.

3 (f) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendments made by
5 this section shall take effect on March 1, 2025.

6 (2) AGENCY ACTIONS.—Effective on and after
7 the date of enactment of this Act, each agency shall
8 take such actions as necessary to prepare and sub-
9 mit any plan or report in accordance with the
10 amendments made by this Act.

11 **SEC. 8. BIENNIAL APPROPRIATIONS BILLS.**

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title III of the Congressional
13 Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 631 et seq.), as amended
14 by section 6(a), is amended by adding at the end the fol-
15 lowing:

16 “CONSIDERATION OF BIENNIAL APPROPRIATIONS BILLS

17 “SEC. 317. It shall not be in order in the House of
18 Representatives or the Senate in any odd-numbered year
19 to consider any regular bill providing new budget authority
20 or a limitation on obligations under the jurisdiction of any
21 of the subcommittees of the Committees on Appropria-
22 tions for only the first fiscal year of a biennium, unless
23 the program, project, or activity for which the new budget
24 authority or obligation limitation is provided will require
25 no additional authority beyond 1 year and will be com-

1 pleted or terminated after the amount provided has been
2 expended.”.

3 (b) AMENDMENT TO TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The
4 table of contents in section 1(b) of the Congressional
5 Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is amend-
6 ed by inserting after the item relating to section 316, as
7 added by section 6(b) the following:

“Sec. 317. Consideration of biennial appropriations bills.”.

8 **SEC. 9. REPORT ON TWO-YEAR FISCAL PERIOD.**

9 Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment
10 of this Act, the Director of the Office of Management and
11 Budget shall—

12 (1) determine the impact and feasibility of
13 changing the definition of a fiscal year and the
14 budget process based on that definition to a 2-year
15 fiscal period with a biennial budget process based on
16 the 2-year period; and

17 (2) report the findings of the study to the Com-
18 mittee on the Budget of the House of Representa-
19 tives and the Committee on the Budget of the Sen-
20 ate.

21 **SEC. 10. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

22 Except as provided in sections 7 and 9, this Act and
23 the amendments made by this Act shall take effect on Jan-
24 uary 1, 2025, and shall apply to budget resolutions and

- 1 appropriations for the biennium beginning with fiscal year
- 2 2026.
