# S. 3971

To amend the Small Business Act to require reporting on additional information with respect to small business concerns owned and controlled by women, qualified HUBZone small business concerns, and small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans, and for other purposes.

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## A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act to require reporting on additional information with respect to small business concerns owned and controlled by women, qualified HUBZone small business concerns, and small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans, and for other purposes.

- 1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
- 2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1   **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       This Act may be cited as the “Small Business Con-  
3   tracting Transparency Act of 2024”.

4   **SEC. 2. REPORT ON SMALL BUSINESS CONCERNS OWNED  
5                    AND CONTROLLED BY WOMEN.**

6       (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 8(m) of the Small Busi-  
7   ness Act (15 U.S.C. 637(m)) is amended by adding at the  
8   end the following:

9                    “(9) REPORT.—Not later than May 1, 2024,  
10   and annually thereafter, the Administrator shall sub-  
11   mit to the Committee on Small Business and Entre-  
12   preneurship of the Senate and the Committee on  
13   Small Business of the House of Representatives a  
14   report on small business concerns owned and con-  
15   trolled by women, which shall include, for the fiscal  
16   year preceding the date of the report, the following:

17                    “(A) The number of applications for cer-  
18   tification as a small business concern owned  
19   and controlled by women that have sufficient  
20   information for the Administrator to make a  
21   certification determination, disaggregated by—

22                    “(i) the number of applications cer-  
23   tified;

24                    “(ii) the number of applications de-  
25    nied; and

1               “(iii) the number of applications for  
2 which a determination has not been made.

3               “(B) The number of concerns certified as  
4 small business concerns owned and controlled  
5 by women by a national certifying entity ap-  
6 proved by the Administrator.

7               “(C) The amount of fees, if any, charged  
8 by each national certifying entity for the certifi-  
9 cation described in subparagraph (B).

10               “(D) The total dollar amount and total  
11 percentage of prime contracts awarded to small  
12 business concerns owned and controlled by  
13 women pursuant to paragraph (2) or pursuant  
14 to a waiver granted under paragraph (3).

15               “(E) The total dollar amount and total  
16 percentage of prime contracts awarded to small  
17 business concerns owned and controlled by  
18 women pursuant to paragraphs (7) and (8).

19               “(F) With respect to a contract incorrectly  
20 awarded pursuant to this subsection because it  
21 was awarded based on an industry in which  
22 small business concerns owned and controlled  
23 by women are not underrepresented—

24               “(i) the number of such contracts;

1               “(ii) the Federal agencies that issued  
2               such contracts; and

3               “(iii) any steps taken by Adminis-  
4               trator to train the personnel of each Fed-  
5               eral agency described in clause (ii) on the  
6               use of the authority provided under this  
7               subsection.

8               “(G) With respect to an examination de-  
9               scribed in paragraph (5)(B)—

10              “(i) the number of examinations due  
11              because of recertification requirements and  
12              the actual number of examinations con-  
13              ducted; and

14              “(ii) the number of examinations con-  
15              ducted for any other reason.

16              “(H) The number of small business con-  
17              cerns owned and controlled by women that were  
18              found to be ineligible to be awarded a contract  
19              under this subsection as a result of an examina-  
20              tion conducted pursuant to paragraph (5)(B) or  
21              failure to request an examination pursuant to  
22              section 127.400 of title 13, Code of Federal  
23              Regulations, or any successor regulation.

1           “(I) The number of small business con-  
2       cerns owned and controlled by women that were  
3       decertified.

4           “(J) The total number of small business  
5       concerns owned and controlled by women.

6           “(K) Any other information the Adminis-  
7       trator determines necessary.”.

8       (b) TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.—Section 8(m)(2)(C)  
9       of the Small Business Act is amended by striking “para-  
10      graph (3)” and inserting “paragraph (4)”.

11      **SEC. 3. REPORT ON SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN OWNED  
12                          AND CONTROLLED BY QUALIFIED HUBZONE  
13                          SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN.**

14       Section 31 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.  
15      657a) is amended—

16           (1) by redesignating subsection (f) as sub-  
17       section (g); and

18           (2) by inserting after subsection (e) the fol-  
19       lowing:

20           “(f) REPORT.—Not later than May 1, 2024, and an-  
21       nually thereafter, the Administrator shall submit to the  
22       Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship of  
23       the Senate and the Committee on Small Business of the  
24       House of Representatives a report on HUBZone small

1 business concerns, which shall include, for the fiscal year  
2 preceding the date of the report, the following:

3           “(1) The number of applications for certification  
4           as a qualified HUBZone small business concern that have sufficient information for the Administrator to make a certification determination,  
5           disaggregated by—  
6  
7

8           “(A) the number of applications certified;  
9           “(B) the number of applications denied;

10           and

11           “(C) the number of applications for which  
12           a determination has not been made.

13           “(2) The total dollar amount and total percentage of prime contracts awarded to qualified HUBZone small business concerns pursuant to this section.

14           “(3) The total dollar amount and percent of sole source contracts awarded to qualified HUBZone small business concerns under subsection (e)(2)(A).

15           “(4) With respect to an examination described in subsection (d)(5)—

16           “(A) the number of examinations due because of recertification requirements and the actual number of examinations conducted; and

1               “(B) the number of examinations con-  
2               ducted for any other reason.

3               “(5) The number of HUBZone small business  
4               concerns that were found to be ineligible to be  
5               awarded a contract under this subsection as a result  
6               of an examination conducted pursuant to subsection  
7               (d)(5) or a verification conducted pursuant to sub-  
8               section (d)(2).

9               “(6) The number of small business concerns  
10              that were decertified as qualified HUBZone small  
11              business concerns.

12              “(7) The number of qualified HUBZone small  
13              business concerns.

14              “(8) Any other information the Administrator  
15              determines necessary.”.

16 **SEC. 4. REPORT ON SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN OWNED**  
17               **AND CONTROLLED BY SERVICE-DISABLED**  
18               **VETERANS.**

19              Section 36 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.  
20 657f) is amended by adding at the end the following:

21              “(j) REPORT.—Not later than May 1, 2024, and an-  
22 nually thereafter, the Administrator shall submit to the  
23 Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship of  
24 the Senate and the Committee on Small Business of the  
25 House of Representatives a report on small business con-

1   eerns owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans;  
2   which shall include, for the fiscal year preceding the date  
3   of the report, the following:

4                 “(1) The total number of small business eon-  
5    cerns eertified as small business eoneerns owned and  
6    controlled by service-disabled veterans.

7                 “(2) The total dollar amount and total percent-  
8    age of prime contracts awarded to small business  
9    eoneerns owned and controlled by service-disabled  
10   veterans pursuant to this section.

11                 “(3) The total dollar amount and percent of  
12    sole source contracts awarded to owned and eon-  
13    trolled by service-disabled veterans pursuant to sub-  
14    sektion (e).

15                 “(4) With respect to an examination described  
16    in subsection (h)(2)—

17                     “(A) the number of examinations due be-  
18    cause of reecertification requirements and the  
19    actual number of such examinations conducted;  
20    and

21                     “(B) the number of examinations con-  
22    ducted for any other reason.

23                 “(5) The number of small business eoneerns  
24    owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans  
25    that were found to be ineligible to be awarded a con-

1 tract under this subsection as a result of an exam-  
2 ination conducted pursuant to subsection (h)(2).

3 “(6) The number of small business concerns de-  
4 certified as small business concerns owned and con-  
5 trolled by service-disabled veterans.

6 “(7) The total number of small business con-  
7 cerns owned and controlled by service-disabled vet-  
8 erans.

9 “(8) Any other information the Administrator  
10 determines necessary.”.

11 **SEC. 5. COMPLIANCE WITH CUTGO.**

12 No additional amounts are authorized to be appro-  
13 priated to carry out this Act or the amendments made  
14 by this Act.

15 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

16 This Act may be cited as the “Small Business Con-  
17 tracting Transparency Act of 2024”.

18 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON SMALL BUSINESS CONCERNS OWNED  
19 AND CONTROLLED BY WOMEN.**

20 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—Section 8(m) of the Small Business  
21 Act (15 U.S.C. 637(m)) is amended by adding at the end  
22 the following:

23 “(9) *REPORT.*—Not later than 1 year after the  
24 date of enactment of the Small Business Contracting  
25 Transparency Act of 2024, and annually thereafter,

1       *the Administrator shall submit to the Committee on*  
2       *Small Business and Entrepreneurship of the Senate*  
3       *and the Committee on Small Business of the House*  
4       *of Representatives a report on small business concerns*  
5       *owned and controlled by women, which shall include,*  
6       *for the fiscal year preceding the date of the report, the*  
7       *following:*

8               “(A) *The number of applications for certifi-*  
9       *cation as a small business concern owned and*  
10      *controlled by women that have sufficient infor-*  
11      *mation for the Administrator to make a certifi-*  
12      *cation determination, disaggregated by—*

13               “(i) *the number of applications cer-*  
14      *tified;*

15               “(ii) *the number of applications de-*  
16      *nied; and*

17               “(iii) *the number of applications for*  
18      *which a determination has not been made.*

19               “(B) *The number of concerns certified as*  
20      *small business concerns owned and controlled by*  
21      *women by a national certifying entity approved*  
22      *by the Administrator.*

23               “(C) *The amount of fees, if any, charged by*  
24      *each national certifying entity for the certifi-*  
25      *cation described in subparagraph (B).*

1           “(D) The total dollar amount and total per-  
2           centage of prime contracts awarded to small  
3           business concerns owned and controlled by  
4           women pursuant to paragraph (2) or pursuant  
5           to a waiver granted under paragraph (3).

6           “(E) The total dollar amount and total per-  
7           centage of prime contracts awarded to small  
8           business concerns owned and controlled by  
9           women pursuant to paragraph (7) or (8).

10          “(F) With respect to a contract incorrectly  
11           awarded pursuant to this subsection because it  
12           was awarded based on an industry in which  
13           small business concerns owned and controlled by  
14           women are not underrepresented—

15           “(i) the number of such contracts;  
16           “(ii) the Federal agencies that issued  
17           such contracts; and

18           “(iii) any steps taken by the Adminis-  
19           trator to train the personnel of each Federal  
20           agency described in clause (ii) on the use of  
21           the authority provided under this sub-  
22           section.

23          “(G) With respect to an examination de-  
24           scribed in paragraph (5)(B)—

1                   “(i) the number of examinations due  
2                   because of recertification requirements and  
3                   the actual number of examinations con-  
4                   ducted; and

5                   “(ii) the number of examinations con-  
6                   ducted for any other reason.

7                   “(H) The number of small business concerns  
8                   owned and controlled by women that were found  
9                   to be ineligible to be awarded a contract under  
10                  this subsection as a result of an examination  
11                  conducted pursuant to paragraph (5)(B) or fail-  
12                  ure to request an examination pursuant to sec-  
13                  tion 127.400 of title 13, Code of Federal Regula-  
14                  tions, or any successor regulation.

15                  “(I) The number of small business concerns  
16                  owned and controlled by women that were decer-  
17                  tified.

18                  “(J) The total number of small business  
19                  concerns owned and controlled by women.

20                  “(K) Any other information the Adminis-  
21                  trator determines necessary.”.

22                  (b) TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.—Section 8(m)(2)(C) of  
23                  the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 637(m)(2)(C)) is amend-  
24                  ed by striking “paragraph (3)” and inserting “paragraph  
25                  (4)”.

1   **SEC. 3. REPORT ON SMALL BUSINESS CONCERNS OWNED**  
2                   **AND CONTROLLED BY QUALIFIED HUBZONE**  
3                   **SMALL BUSINESS CONCERNS.**

4       *Section 31 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 657a)*

5   *is amended—*

6           *(1) by redesignating subsection (f) as subsection*  
7           *(g); and*

8           *(2) by inserting after subsection (e) the following:*

9           “*(f) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date of*  
10   *enactment of the Small Business Contracting Transparency*  
11   *Act of 2024, and annually thereafter, the Administrator*  
12   *shall submit to the Committee on Small Business and En-*  
13   *trepreneurship of the Senate and the Committee on Small*  
14   *Business of the House of Representatives a report on*  
15   *HUBZone small business concerns, which shall include, for*  
16   *the fiscal year preceding the date of the report, the fol-*  
17   *lowing:*

18           “*(1) The number of applications for certification*  
19           *as a qualified HUBZone small business concern that*  
20           *have sufficient information for the Administrator to*  
21           *make a certification determination, disaggregated*

3           “(2) The total dollar amount and total percent-  
4           age of prime contracts awarded to qualified  
5           HUBZone small business concerns pursuant to this  
6           section.

7           “(3) The total dollar amount and percent of sole  
8           source contracts awarded to qualified HUBZone  
9           small business concerns under subsection (c)(2)(A).

10          “(4) With respect to an examination described in  
11           subsection (d)(5)—

12          “(A) the number of examinations due be-  
13           cause of recertification requirements and the ac-  
14           tual number of examinations conducted; and

15          “(B) the number of examinations conducted  
16           for any other reason.

17          “(5) The number of HUBZone small business  
18           concerns that were found to be ineligible to be award-  
19           ed a contract under this subsection as a result of an  
20           examination conducted pursuant to subsection (d)(5)  
21           or a verification conducted pursuant to subsection  
22           (d)(2).

23          “(6) The number of small business concerns that  
24           were decertified as qualified HUBZone small business  
25           concerns.

1           “(7) *The number of qualified HUBZone small*  
2       *business concerns.*

3           “(8) *Any other information the Administrator*  
4       *determines necessary.”.*

5   **SEC. 4. REPORT ON SMALL BUSINESS CONCERNS OWNED**  
6                   **AND CONTROLLED BY SERVICE-DISABLED**  
7                   **VETERANS.**

8       *Section 36 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 657f)*  
9   *is amended by adding at the end the following:*

10          “(j) *REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date of*  
11       *enactment of the Small Business Contracting Transparency*  
12       *Act of 2024, and annually thereafter, the Administrator*  
13       *shall submit to the Committee on Small Business and En-*  
14       *trepreneurship of the Senate and the Committee on Small*  
15       *Business of the House of Representatives a report on small*  
16       *business concerns owned and controlled by service-disabled*  
17       *veterans, which shall include, for the fiscal year preceding*  
18       *the date of the report, the following:*

19          “(1) *The total number of small business concerns*  
20       *certified as small business concerns owned and con-*  
21       *trolled by service-disabled veterans.*

22          “(2) *The total dollar amount and total percent-*  
23       *age of prime contracts awarded to small business con-*  
24       *cerns owned and controlled by service-disabled vet-*  
25       *erans pursuant to this section.*

1           “(3) The total dollar amount and percent of sole  
2 source contracts awarded to small business concerns  
3 owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans  
4 pursuant to subsection (c).

5           “(4) With respect to an examination described in  
6 subsection (h)(2)—

7                 “(A) the number of examinations due be-  
8 cause of recertification requirements and the ac-  
9 tual number of such examinations conducted;  
10 and

11                 “(B) the number of examinations conducted  
12 for any other reason.

13           “(5) The number of small business concerns  
14 owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans that

24 determines necessary.”.
