A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration to implement the anti-fraud and abuse recommendations of the Comptroller General of the United States, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Preventing Terrorist
5 and Narcotic Air Events Act of 2024”.

6 **SEC. 2. IMPLEMENTATION OF ANTI-TERRORIST AND NAR-**
7 **COTIC AIR EVENTS PROGRAMS.**

8 (a) IMPLEMENTATION.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
2 after the date of enactment of this section, the Ad-
3 ministrator of the Federal Aviation Administration
4 (in this section referred to as the “Administrator”)
5 shall implement the anti-fraud and abuse rec-
6 ommendations described in paragraph (2).

7 (2) RECOMMENDATIONS DESCRIBED.—For pur-
8 poses of this section, the term “anti-fraud and abuse
9 recommendations” means the recommendations set
10 forth in the Government Accountability Office report
11 entitled “Aviation: FAA Needs to Better Prevent,
12 Detect, and Respond to Fraud and Abuse Risks in
13 Aircraft Registration,” (dated March 25, 2020).

14 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 60 days after the date
15 on which the Administrator implements the recommenda-
16 tions under subsection (a), the Administrator shall submit
17 to the Committees on the Judiciary and Commerce,
18 Science, and Transportation of the Senate, the Commit-
19 tees on the Judiciary and Energy and Commerce of the
20 House of Representatives, and the Caucus on Inter-
21 national Narcotics Control of the Senate a report on such
22 implementation, including a description of any steps taken
23 by the Administrator to complete such implementation.

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
