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# A BILL

To contribute funds and artifacts to the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library in Medora, North Dakota.

- 1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
- 2       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**
- 3       This Act may be cited as the “Theodore Roosevelt
- 4       Presidential Library Act”.

1   **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

2       Congress finds that—

3           (1) the Theodore Roosevelt Association was  
4       founded in 1919 and chartered by Congress in 1920  
5       to perpetuate the memory of Theodore Roosevelt for  
6       the benefit of the people of the United States and  
7       the world;

8           (2) the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library  
9       would—

10           (A) celebrate the unique legacy of 1 of the  
11       most influential Presidents; and

12           (B) actively bring the lessons of the life of  
13       Theodore Roosevelt to present and future genera-  
14       tions; and

15           (3) many of the artifacts and memorabilia of  
16       Theodore Roosevelt—

17           (A) are scattered across the United States;  
18       and

19           (B) are not available to the public for view-  
20       ing.

21   **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.**

22       In this Act:

23           (1) FOUNDATION.—The term “Foundation”  
24       means the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library  
25       Foundation.

1                   (2) LIBRARY.—The term “Library” means the  
2                   Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library to be lo-  
3                   cated in Medora, North Dakota.

4                   (3) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
5                   the Secretary of the Interior.

6                   **SEC. 4. FEDERAL CONTRIBUTIONS TOWARD ESTABLISH-**  
7                   **MENT OF THE THEODORE ROOSEVELT PRESI-**  
8                   **DENTIAL LIBRARY.**

9                   (a) GRANTS.—

10                  (1) AUTHORIZATION.—To the extent provided  
11                  in advance in appropriations Acts and subject to  
12                  paragraphs (2) and (3), the Secretary shall provide  
13                  a grant to the Foundation for the establishment of  
14                  the Library—

15                  (A) to preserve and make available to the  
16                  public materials relating to the life of President  
17                  Theodore Roosevelt; and

18                  (B) to provide interpretive and educational  
19                  services that communicate the meaning of the  
20                  life of Theodore Roosevelt.

21                  (2) MATCHING REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary  
22                  may not provide a grant under paragraph (1) until  
23                  the date on which the Foundation certifies to the  
24                  Secretary that the Foundation has received an  
25                  amount equal to not less than double the amount of

1       the grant funds to be provided under that paragraph  
2       from funds for the Library—

3                 (A) contributed by the State of North Da-  
4       kota; or

5                 (B) raised from non-Federal sources dur-  
6       ing the period beginning on the date on which  
7       the Foundation was established and ending on  
8       the date of the certification.

9                 (3) PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS.—Grant  
10      funds provided under this subsection may not be  
11      used for the maintenance or operation of the Li-  
12      brary.

13                 (b) FEDERAL ARTIFACTS AND OBJECTS RELATING  
14      TO THEODORE ROOSEVELT.—

15                 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days  
16      after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-  
17      retary shall—

18                 (A) offer to enter into 1 or more agree-  
19      ments with the Foundation; and

20                 (B) enter into any related interagency  
21      agreements that the Secretary determines to be  
22      necessary, to preserve and exhibit at the Li-  
23      brary, for the benefit of the public, Federal eu-  
24      ratorial collections relating to the life and leg-  
25      acy of Theodore Roosevelt.

1                   (2) REQUIREMENTS.—An agreement entered  
2       into with the Foundation under paragraph (1) shall  
3       provide for the loan, transfer, or conveyance from  
4       Federal agencies (including the National Park Serv-  
5       ice, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, the  
6       Library of Congress, and the National Archives and  
7       Records Administration) to the Foundation of his-  
8       toric, educational, artistic, natural, and other mu-  
9       seum artifacts and objects, particularly artifacts and  
10      objects of Federal agencies that are not on display  
11      to the public, without monetary consideration, sub-  
12      ject to such terms and conditions as the Secretary  
13      determines to be necessary for the preservation and  
14      exhibition of the artifacts and objects.

15                   (e) NON-FEDERAL OPERATION.—The Secretary or  
16      any other Federal entity shall have no involvement in the  
17      operation of the Library, except at the request of the non-  
18      Federal entity responsible for the operation of the Library.

19                   (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—In addi-  
20      tion to other amounts made available to carry out the pur-  
21      poses of this Act, there are authorized to be appropriated  
22      such sums as are necessary to carry out this Act (includ-  
23      ing providing a grant under subsection (a)) for fiscal year  
24      2024 and each subsequent fiscal year, to remain available  
25      until expended.

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2        *This Act may be cited as the “Theodore Roosevelt Pres-  
3 idential Library Museum Artifacts Act”.*

4 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

5        *In this Act:*

6                (1) **FOUNDATION.**—The term “Foundation”  
7 means the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library  
8 Foundation.

9                (2) **LIBRARY.**—The term “Library” means the  
10 Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library to be located  
11 in Medora, North Dakota.

12                (3) **SECRETARY.**—The term “Secretary” means  
13 the Secretary of the Interior.

14 **SEC. 3. FEDERAL CONTRIBUTIONS TOWARD ESTABLISH-  
15 MENT OF THE THEODORE ROOSEVELT PRESI-  
16 DENTIAL LIBRARY.**

17        (a) **GRANTS.**—

18                (1) **AUTHORIZATION.**—To the extent provided in  
19 advance in appropriations Acts and subject to para-  
20 graphs (2) and (3), the Secretary may provide to the  
21 Foundation grants in an amount not to exceed a total  
22 of \$50,000,000 for the establishment of the Library—

23                        (A) to preserve and make available to the  
24 public materials relating to the life of President  
25 Theodore Roosevelt; and

1                   (B) to provide interpretive and educational  
2                   services that communicate the meaning of the life  
3                   of Theodore Roosevelt.

4                   (2) MATCHING REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary  
5                   may not provide a grant under paragraph (1) until  
6                   the date on which the Foundation certifies to the Sec-  
7                   retary that the Foundation has received an amount  
8                   equal to not less than \$100,000,000 from funds for the  
9                   Library—

10                  (A) contributed by the State of North Da-  
11                  kota; or

12                  (B) raised from non-Federal sources during  
13                  the period beginning on the date on which the  
14                  Foundation was established and ending on the  
15                  date of the certification.

16                  (3) PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS.—Grant  
17                  funds provided under this subsection may not be used  
18                  for the maintenance or operation of the Library.

19                  (b) FEDERAL ARTIFACTS AND OBJECTS RELATING TO  
20                  THEODORE ROOSEVELT.—Not later than 180 days after the  
21                  date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary may enter into  
22                  1 or more agreements with the Foundation to provide for  
23                  a loan to the Foundation from Federal agencies under the  
24                  administrative jurisdiction of the Secretary (including the  
25                  National Park Service and the United States Fish and

1   *Wildlife Service) of historic, educational, artistic, natural,*  
2   *and other museum artifacts and objects, particularly arti-*  
3   *facts and objects that are not on display to the public, with-*  
4   *out monetary consideration, subject to such terms and con-*  
5   *ditions as the Secretary determines to be necessary for the*  
6   *preservation and exhibition of the artifacts and objects*  
7   *loaned to the Foundation.*

8           (c) *NON-FEDERAL OPERATION.—The Secretary or any*  
9   *other Federal entity shall have no involvement in the oper-*  
10   *ation of the Library, except at the request of the non-Federal*  
11   *entity responsible for the operation of the Library in ac-*  
12   *cordance with applicable laws (including regulations).*
