To amend title 36, United States Code, to designate the bald eagle as the national bird.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

1	SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF BALD EAGLE AS NATIONAL
2	BIRD.
3	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
4	(1) bald eagles are a historical symbol of the
5	United States representing independence, strength,
6	and freedom;
7	(2) the bald eagle is unique to North America;
8	(3) on June 20, 1782, the bald eagle was
9	adopted as the Coat of Arms for the United States
10	Great Seal;
11	(4) the bald eagle image remains the leading in-
12	signia for all branches of the United States military;
13	(5) the bald eagle is the leading image on thou-
14	sands of Federal Government branches, depart-
15	ments, and agencies, including the President, Vice-
16	President, Congress, and Senate;
17	(6) the bald eagle serves as the logo, trade-
18	mark, and brand icon for businesses, nonprofit orga-
19	nizations, and sports teams across the United
20	States;
21	(7) bald eagles are integral to the spiritual lives
22	and sacred belief systems of most Indigenous peoples
23	and Tribal communities;
24	(8) bald eagles are prevalent in belief, practice,
25	stories, ceremonies, dance, traditions, songs, regalia,

1	flags, insignias, arts, craft, and other forms of spir-
2	itual reverence;
3	(9) bald eagle festivals are—
4	(A) held in over 100 locations across the
5	United States; and
6	(B) key components of community engage-
7	ment;
8	(10) the bald eagle is prevalent on—
9	(A) hundreds of United States stamps; and
10	(B) many United States coins and cur-
11	rencies;
12	(11) the bald eagle is a primary component and
13	symbol on Federal and State flags throughout the
14	United States; and
15	(12) joint efforts of the Federal Government
16	and State and local governments, nonprofit organi-
17	zations, and individuals have contributed to the suc-
18	cessful recovery of the bald eagle.
19	(b) DESIGNATION.—Chapter 3 of title 36, United
20	States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
21	lowing:
22	"§ 306. National bird
23	"The bald eagle (Haliaeetus leucocephalus) is the na-
24	tional bird.".

(c) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—The table of sec tions for chapter 3 of title 36, United States Code, is
 amended—

4 (1) in the chapter heading, by striking "AND
5 TREE" and inserting "TREE, AND BIRD";
6 and

7 (2) by adding at the end the following: "306. National bird.".

8 (d) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-9 tion, the amendments made by this section, or the adop-10 tion of the bald eagle as the national bird of the United 11 States may be construed or used as a reason to alter, 12 change, modify, or otherwise affect any plan, policy, man-13 agement decision, regulation, or other action of the Fed-14 eral Government.
