A BILL

To prescribe requirements relating to the management of the Federal property commonly known as Plum Island, New York, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “~~Plum Island Preserva-~~
5 ~~tion Act~~”.

1 **SEC. 2. PERMANENT PRESERVATION OF PLUM ISLAND,**
2 **NEW YORK.**

3 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The Federal property commonly
4 known as Plum Island, New York, shall be protected in
5 perpetuity for the purpose of ecological conservation, his-
6 torical preservation, and the discovery and celebration of
7 the shared cultural heritage of the Island.

8 (b) **REQUIREMENT.**—Not later than 180 days after
9 the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of
10 General Services (referred to in this section as the “Ad-
11 ministrator”), in consultation with relevant Federal and
12 State agencies and other relevant stakeholders, shall ini-
13 tiate a process to create a plan for the management of
14 the Federal property commonly known as Plum Island,
15 New York, in accordance with subsection (a).

16 (c) **REPORTS.**—Not later than 2 years after the date
17 on which the Administrator, in consultation with relevant
18 Federal and State agencies and other relevant stake-
19 holders, initiates the process required under subsection
20 (b), and each year thereafter until the date that is 1 year
21 after the date on which the plan required under that sub-
22 section is completed, the Administrator shall submit to the
23 Committees on Homeland Security and Governmental Af-
24 fairs and Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate and
25 the Committees on Energy and Commerce, Natural Re-

1 sources, and Oversight and Accountability of the House
2 of Representatives a report that describes—

3 (1) the stakeholders consulted during that proe-
4 ess;

5 (2) the items discussed or reviewed during that
6 process for the period covered by the applicable re-
7 port;

8 (3) the outcomes of that process, or expected
9 outcomes if the process is ongoing;

10 (4) if that process is not completed, the esti-
11 mated timeline for completion; and

12 (5) if that process is completed, the rec-
13 ommended plan for management of the Federal
14 property commonly known as Plum Island, New
15 York, in accordance with subsection (a).

16 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

17 *This Act may be cited as the “Plum Island Preserva-*
18 *tion Act”.*

19 **SEC. 2. PERMANENT PRESERVATION OF PLUM ISLAND, NEW**
20 **YORK.**

21 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—*The consolidated Federal asset com-*
22 *monly known as Plum Island, New York, and all associated*
23 *real and personal properties, including the Orient Point,*
24 *New York, terminal and facilities (referred to in this section*

1 as “Plum Island”), shall be protected in perpetuity for the
2 purposes of—

3 (1) ecological conservation;

4 (2) discovery and celebration of the historical
5 and cultural heritage of Plum Island; and

6 (3) maintaining access to Plum Island.

7 (b) *REQUIREMENT.*—Not later than 180 days after the
8 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of General
9 Services (referred to in this section as the “Administrator”),
10 in consultation with the Secretary of Homeland Security,
11 the Secretary of the Interior, relevant Federal and State
12 agencies, Tribal governments, and other stakeholders, shall
13 initiate a process to commence formal visioning sessions
14 that may form the basis for a future ecological management
15 plan for Plum Island in accordance with subsection (a).

16 (c) *REPORTS.*—Not later than 2 years after the date
17 on which the Administrator, in consultation with the Sec-
18 retary of Homeland Security, the Secretary of the Interior,
19 relevant Federal and State agencies, Tribal governments,
20 and other stakeholders, initiates the process required under
21 subsection (b), and each year thereafter until the date that
22 is 1 year after the date on which the visioning sessions re-
23 quired under that subsection are completed, the Adminis-
24 trator shall submit to the Committees on Homeland Secu-
25 rity and Governmental Affairs and Energy and Natural

3 *ability of the House of Representatives a report that de-*
4 *scribes—*

5 (1) *the Federal and State agencies, Tribal gov-*

8 (2) *the items discussed or reviewed during that*
9 *process for the period covered by the applicable report;*

10 (3) *the outcomes of that process, or expected out-*
11 *comes if the process is ongoing;*

12 (4) *if that process is not completed, the estimated*
13 *timeline for completion; and*

14 (5) *if that process is completed, the recommenda-*
15 *tions from those visioning sessions that may form the*
16 *basis for a future ecological management plan for*
17 *Plum Island.*

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
