AN ACT

- To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to enhance the Comprehensive Opioid Abuse Grant Program, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Opioid Overdose Data3 Collection Enhancement Act".

4 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.

5 The purpose of this Act is to expand the adoption 6 and implementation of, and provide interoperability of, 7 data collection tools used to track fatal and nonfatal 8 overdoses and opioid overdose reversal medication admin-9 istration in near real-time through a web-based, mobile-10 friendly software platform.

11 SEC. 3. COMPREHENSIVE OPIOID ABUSE GRANT PROGRAM.

Section 3021 of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control
and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10701) is amended—

7	government, coalition of law enforcement agencies,

12	lic health responses to the data collected by the
13	tool described in paragraph (1);
14	"(B) focus on areas in which fatal and
15	nonfatal overdoses occur and trends of concern;
16	"(C) provide for interoperability with exist-
17	ing Federal, State, local, and Tribal overdose
18	data collection tools and overdose data collec-
19	tion tools of coalitions of law enforcement agen-
20	cies; and
21	"(D) make data collected through the pro-
22	gram available to Federal, State, Tribal, and
23	territorial governments and coalitions of law en-
24	forcement agencies.

1	"(4) AUDIT; APPLICATION.—A State, unit of
2	local government, coalition of law enforcement agen-
3	cies, or Indian tribe seeking to use a grant received
4	under subsection (a) for a program described in
5	paragraph (1) of this subsection shall—
6	"(A) conduct an audit of available data
7	and resources; and
8	"(B) in order to avoid duplication, submit
9	the audit conducted under subparagraph (A) as
10	a part of the application for the grant of the
11	State, unit of local government, coalition of law
12	enforcement agencies, or Indian tribe.
13	"(5) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out this sub-
14	section, the Attorney General shall consult with the
15	heads of agencies that maintain overdose data collec-
16	tion tools, including the Director of the Office of Na-
17	tional Drug Control Policy.".
