A BILL

To amend the Tariff Act of 1930 to protect personally identifiable information, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Moving Americans Pri-
5 vacy Protection Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE IN-**
7 **FORMATION.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (2) of section 431(c)
9 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1431(c)) is amended
10 to read as follows:

1 “(2)(A) The information listed in paragraph (1) shall
2 not be available for public disclosure if—

3 “(i) the Secretary of the Treasury makes an af-
4 firmative finding on a shipment-by-shipment basis
5 that disclosure is likely to pose a threat of personal
6 injury or property damage; or

7 “(ii) the information is exempt under the provi-
8 sions of section 552(b)(1) of title 5, United States
9 Code.

10 “(B) The Secretary shall ensure that any personally
11 identifiable information, including Social Security num-
12 bers and passport numbers, is removed from any manifest
13 signed, produced, delivered, or electronically transmitted
14 under this section before access to the manifest is provided
15 to the public.”.

16 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
17 subsection (a) shall take effect on the date that is 30 days
18 after the date of the enactment of this Act.
