Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this bill may cost the State Board of Education approximately \$803,100 ongoing from the Education Fund beginning in FY 2019 to provide educator salary adjustments to certain educators licensed through the State Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing (DOPL) and not the State Board of Education, namely, social workers, psychologists, speech pathologists, and audiologists. The State Board of Education estimates approximately 154 additional qualifying educators will receive the \$5,215 salary adjustment (\$4,200 adjustment plus \$1,015 in employer paid benefits.)
