Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health from the General Fund \$3,400 in FY 2021, \$71,900 in FY 2022, and \$5,100 ongoing beginning in FY 2023 for modifications to the abortion module, expanded reporting requirements, and producing a resource list. The Department of Health has indicated that it can absorb \$4,300 of the ongoing costs for a new server.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could increase revenue to local governments up to \$50,000/case for fines. This bill could also cost justice courts an unknown amount in court processing costs.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that physicians violate provisions of this bill, this could cost certain offenders up to \$50,000/case, however the total amount is unknown.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

No performance note required for this bill

Notes on Notes

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
