Enactment of this legislation could reduce state revenues to the Transportation fund by \$807,000, the Transportation Investment Fund by \$777,000, the Uniform School Fund by \$72,500, and other restricted revenue by \$120,300 ongoing beginning in fiscal year 2025 due to mid-year registration cancellations. Due to delayed implementation, the cost in fiscal year 2025 would be approximately half of the ongoing total for each fund.

Enactment of this legislation could also reduce state revenues one-time to the Transportation fund by \$9.44 million in fiscal year 2025, and by \$3.15 million in fiscal year 2026; the Transportation Investment Fund by \$9.08 million in fiscal year 2025, and by 3.03 million in fiscal year 2026; the Uniform School Fund by \$660,000 fiscal year 2025, and by \$230,000 fiscal year 2026; other restricted revenue by \$1.65 million fiscal year 2025, and by \$544,000 in fiscal year 2026 due to delayed collection of registration fees.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Tax Commission \$49,200 from the General Fund one time in fiscal year 2025 for modifications to the vehicle registry system.

**Local Government**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could reduce revenue to local governments \$2.02 million ongoing beginning in fiscal year 2025 due to mid-year registration cancellations. Due to delayed implementation, the reduced revenue in fiscal year 2025 would be approximately half the ongoing total. It could also reduce revenue to local governments \$23.5 million one-time in fiscal year 2025, and \$7.84 million one-time in fiscal year 2026 due to delayed collection of registration fees.

**Individuals & Businesses**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could reduce registration fees paid by businesses and individuals by \$3.80 million ongoing beginning in fiscal year 2026 from mid-year registration cancellations. Due to delayed implementation, the savings in fiscal year 2025 is half the ongoing total.

**Regulatory Impact**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

**Performance Evaluation**

JR1-4-601

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

**Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
