Enactment of this bill could cost counties up to an annualized \$400,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2021 as follows: \$350,000 due to additional length of the ballot and the requirement to include a new statewide ballot information guide with each ballot; \$50,000 due to the requirement of a new local ballot information guide included with each ballot and additional local attorney requirements.
