Enactment of this legislation could cost the Lieutenant Governor's Office \$3,300 ongoing beginning in FY 2021 from the General Fund to redact protected information from lists of names of individuals who signed initiative petitions. Enactment could also cost the Lieutenant Governor's Office \$6,100 one-time in FY 2021 from the General Fund to make changes to the voter registration database to provide an electronic list of signatures for initiative petitions and to exclude private voter registration records.
