28	36-12-5. Duties of interim committees.
29	(1) Except as otherwise provided by law, each interim committee shall:
30	(a) receive study assignments by resolution from the Legislature;
31	(b) receive study assignments from the Legislative Management Committee, created
32	under Section 36-12-6;
33	(c) place matters on its study agenda after requesting approval of the study from the
34	Legislative Management Committee, which request, if not disapproved by the Legislative
35	Management Committee within 30 days of receipt of the request, the interim committee shall
36	consider it approved and may proceed with the requested study;
37	(d) request research reports from the professional legislative staff pertaining to the
38	committee's agenda of study;
39	(e) investigate and study possibilities for improvement in government services within
40	its subject area;
41	(f) accept reports from the professional legislative staff and make recommendations for
42	legislative action with respect to such reports; and
43	(g) prepare and recommend to the Legislature a legislative program in response to the
44	committee's study agenda.
45	[(2) (a) As used in this Subsection (2):]
46	[(i) "Health insurance" is as defined in Section 31A-1-301.]
47	[(ii) "Health insurance mandate" means a mandatory obligation with respect to a
48	coverage, benefit, or provider that, but for Title 31A, Insurance Code, would not be required
49	for a policy of health insurance.]
50	[(iii) "Review committee" means:]
51	[(A) the Business and Labor Interim Committee; and]
52	[(B) the Health and Human Services Interim Committee.]
53	[(b) In addition to the duties established pursuant to Subsection (1), annually each
54	review committee shall:]
55	[(i) identify the one or more health insurance mandates listed under Subsection (2)(d)
56	that:]
57	[(A) are in effect for five or more years as of May 1; and]
58	[(B) have not been reviewed during the previous 10 years as of May 1;]

59	[(ii) select which of the one or more health insurance mandates identified under
60	Subsection (2)(b)(i) that the review committee elects to review, subject to the direction of the
61	Legislative Management Committee; and]
62	[(iii) review a health insurance mandate selected under Subsection (2)(b)(ii) to
63	determine whether the health insurance mandate should be continued, modified, or repealed.]
64	[(c) The review under this Subsection (2) shall include:]
65	[(i) the estimated fiscal impact of the health insurance mandate on state and private
66	health insurance; and]
67	[(ii) the purpose and effectiveness of the health insurance mandate.]
68	[(d) The Insurance Department shall:]
69	[(i) provide a list of the health insurance mandates in this state in its annual report; and]
70	[(ii) assist in a review if requested by a review committee.]
71	[(3)] (2) Except as otherwise provided by law, reports and recommendations of the
72	interim committees shall be completed and made public prior to any legislative session at
73	which the reports and recommendations are submitted. A copy of the reports and
74	recommendations shall be mailed to each member or member-elect of the Legislature, to each
75	elective state officer, and to the state library.
