**LONG TITLE**

**General Description:**

This bill enacts language related to a municipal and county governing body.

**Highlighted Provisions:**

This bill:

- ▶ prohibits a municipal or county governing body from expelling a member of the body from an open, public meeting or prohibiting the member from attending; and
- ▶ makes technical corrections.

26 Section 1. Section 10-3-607 is amended to read:

27 **10-3-607. Expulsion of members prohibited -- Exception for disorderly conduct.**

28 (1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), the governing body may not expel a member  
29 of the governing body from an open, public meeting or prohibit the member from attending an  
30 open, public meeting.

31 (2) The governing body of each municipality may fine or expel from an open, public  
32 meeting any member of the governing body for disorderly conduct on a two-thirds vote of the  
33 members of the governing body.

34 Section 2. Section 17-53-206.5 is enacted to read:

35 **17-53-206.5. Expulsion of members prohibited -- Exception for disorderly**  
36 **conduct.**

37 (1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), the governing body may not expel a member  
38 of the governing body from an open, public meeting or prohibit the member from attending an  
39 open, public meeting.

40 (2) The governing body of each county may fine or expel from an open, public meeting  
41 any member of the governing body for disorderly conduct on a two-thirds vote of the members  
42 of the governing body.
