LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill addresses human trafficking education and prevention.

67-5-22.9, Utah Code Annotated 1953

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **67-5-22.9** is enacted to read:

67-5-22.9. State human trafficking intervention coordinator.

(1) The attorney general shall appoint a state human trafficking intervention coordinator.
