General Description:
This bill modifies the Traffic Code by amending provisions relating to operating a
bicycle on the roadway.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
<ul> <li>provides that a person operating a bicycle approaching a stop sign shall stop before</li> </ul>
entering the intersection; and
<ul> <li>provides an exception for a person operating a bicycle approaching a stop sign to</li> </ul>
cautiously make a turn or proceed through the intersection without stopping if the
person:
<ul> <li>slows to a reasonable speed;</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>yields the right-of-way to any vehicle in the intersection or approaching on</li> </ul>
another highway so closely as to constitute an immediate hazard;
<ul> <li>has reasonably determined the movement can be made safely and without</li> </ul>
interfering with the movement of any vehicle or pedestrian; and
• is 18 years of age or older.

(b) Notwithstanding Subsection (5)(a), a person operating a bicycle approaching a stop 65 sign may cautiously make a turn or proceed through the intersection without stopping if the 66 67 person:

(i) slows to a reasonable speed;

69 (ii) yields the right-of-way to any vehicle in the intersection or approaching on another 70 highway so closely as to constitute an immediate hazard;

(iii) has reasonably determined the movement can be made safely and without interfering with the movement of any vehicle or pedestrian; and

(iv) is 18 years of age or older.
