96	(2) if after receiving notice as described in Subsection (1)(a), the federal agency does
97	not respond by the date requested in the notice, or otherwise indicates that it is unwilling to
98	take action to mitigate the risk to the health, safety, or welfare of the people of the political
99	subdivision described in the notice, the chief executive officer or county sheriff may take
100	action to mitigate the risk to the health, safety, or welfare of the people of the political
101	subdivision.
