	Section 1. Section <b>35A-16-204</b> is amended to read:
	35A-16-204. Utah Homelessness Council.
	(1) There is created within the office the Utah Homelessness Council.
	(2) The homelessness council shall consist of the following members:



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28	(a) a representative of the public sector with expertise in homelessness issues,
29	appointed by the Legislature;
30	(b) a representative of the private sector, appointed by the Utah Impact Partnership or
31	the partnership's successor organization;

81	(6) The homelessness council shall meet at least four times per year.
82	(7) A majority of members of the homelessness council constitutes a quorum of the
83	homelessness council at any meeting, and the action of the majority of members present
84	constitutes the action of the homelessness council.
85	(8) A majority of members of the executive committee constitutes a quorum of the
86	executive committee at any meeting, and the action of the majority of members present
87	constitutes the action of the executive committee.
88	(9) (a) Except as required by Subsection (9)(b), appointed members of the
89	homelessness council shall serve a <u>four-year</u> term [of four years].

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(b) [Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsection (9)(a), the] The appointing
authority, at the time of appointment or reappointment, may adjust the length of terms to ensure
that the terms of homelessness council members are staggered so that approximately half of
appointed homelessness council members are appointed every two years.
(10) When a vacancy occurs in the appointed membership for any reason, the
replacement is appointed for the unexpired term.
(11) (a) Except as described in Subsection (11)(b), a member may not receive
compensation or benefits for the member's service[5] but may receive per diem and travel
expenses in accordance with:
(i) Section 63A-3-106;
(ii) Section 63A-3-107; and
(iii) rules made by the Division of Finance [pursuant to] in accordance with Sections
63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107.
(b) Compensation and expenses of a commission member who is a legislator are
governed by Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Legislative Compensation and
Expenses.
(12) The office and the department shall provide administrative support to the
homelessness council.
Section 2. Effective date.

This bill takes effect on May 1, 2024.
