LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends the licensing provision of the Landscape Architects Licensing Act by providing for a continuing education requirement in accordance with standards defined by rule by the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

► provides that a person licensed as a landscape architect shall complete continuing education requirements during each licensing period in accordance with standards defined by rule of the Division of Professional and Occupational Licensing.

58-53-303, as renumbered and amended by Laws of Utah 1998, Chapter 191

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **58-53-303** is amended to read:



28 **58-53-303. Term of license -- Expiration -- Renewal.**

29 (1) (a) The division shall issue each license under this chapter in accordance with a
30 two-year renewal cycle established by rule.

31 (b) The division may by renewal extend or shorten a license expiration date by as
32 much as one year to stagger the renewal cycles it administers.

33 (2) Each license automatically expires on the expiration date shown on the license
34 unless renewed by the licensee in accordance with Section 58-1-308.

35 (3) Each person holding a license under this chapter as a landscape architect shall
36 complete in each period of licensure a program of qualifying continuing professional education
37 in accordance with standards defined by rule by the division in accordance with Title 63G,
38 Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act.
