35	(b) "Caller or text message identification service" means any service or device
36	designed to provide the user of the service or device with the telephone number of, or other
37	information regarding, the origination of a call or text message made using a
38	telecommunications service or VoIP voice service, including automatic number identification
39	services.
40	(c) "Text message":
41	(i) means a real-time or near real-time message consisting of text, images, sounds, or
42	other information transmitted from or received by a device identified by a telephone number;

52	(3) This section does not prevent or restrict any person or individual from blocking the
