29	As used in this chapter:
30	(1) "Big game" includes deer, elk, big horn sheep, moose, mountain goats, pronghorn,
31	and bison.
32	(2) (a) "Centerfire rifle hunt" means a hunt for which a hunter may use a centerfire
33	rifle, except as provided in Subsection (2)(b).
34	(b) "Centerfire rifle hunt" does not include:
35	(i) a bighorn sheep hunt;
36	(ii) a mountain goat hunt;
37	(iii) a bison hunt;
38	(iv) a moose hunt;
39	(v) a hunt requiring the hunter to possess a statewide conservation permit; or

91	(b) a shirt;
92	(c) a jacket;
93	(d) a coat;
94	(e) a vest; or
95	(f) a sweater.
96	[(b) A person shall wear hunter orange material on the head, chest, and back.]
97	[(3) A person]
98	(2) An individual is not required to wear [the] a hunter orange [material] item
99	described in Subsection $[\frac{(2)}{2}]$ $\underline{(1)}$:
100	(a) during the following types of hunts, unless a centerfire rifle hunt is in progress in
101	the same area:
102	(i) archery;
103	(ii) muzzle-loader;
104	(iii) mountain goat;
105	(iv) bighorn sheep;
106	(v) bison; or
107	(vi) moose; or
108	(b) as provided by a rule of the Wildlife Board made in accordance with Title 63G,
109	Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act.
110	(3) The director may regulate the wearing of hunter orange by an individual who is:
111	(a) not hunting, such as a hiker, camper, or other recreational user; and
112	(b) accessing a wildlife management area while a centerfire rifle hunt for big game is in
113	progress on the wildlife management area.
