9	This bill amends provisions in Title 20A, Election Code, relating to the nomination and
10	election of a person to the State Board of Education.

15	 repeals the involvement of the governor and the nominating and recruiting

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **20A-9-403** is amended to read:

20A-9-403. Regular primary elections.

- (1) (a) The fourth Tuesday of June of each even-numbered year is designated as regular primary election day.
- (b) Each registered political party that chooses to use the primary election process to nominate some or all of its candidates shall comply with the requirements of this section.
- (2) (a) As a condition for using the state's election system, each registered political party that wishes to participate in the primary election shall:
 - (i) declare their intent to participate in the primary election;
- (ii) identify one or more registered political parties whose members may vote for the registered political party's candidates and whether or not persons identified as unaffiliated with a political party may vote for the registered political party's candidates; and
- (iii) certify that information to the lieutenant governor no later than 5 p.m. on March 1 of each even-numbered year.
- (b) As a condition for using the state's election system, each registered political party that wishes to participate in the primary election shall:
- (i) certify the name and office of all of the registered political party's candidates to the lieutenant governor no later than 5 p.m. on the first Monday after the third Saturday in April of each even-numbered year; and
- (ii) certify the name and office of each of its county candidates to the county clerks by 5 p.m. on the first Monday after the third Saturday in April of each even-numbered year.
- (c) By 5 p.m. on the first Wednesday after the third Saturday in April of each even-numbered year, the lieutenant governor shall send the county clerks a certified list of the names of all statewide candidates, multicounty candidates, or single county candidates that shall be printed on the primary ballot and the order the candidates are to appear on the ballot in accordance with Section 20A-6-305.
- (d) Except for presidential candidates, if a registered political party does not wish to participate in the primary election, it shall submit the names of its county candidates to the

60	30 of each even-numbered year.
61	(3) (a) The lieutenant governor shall:
62	(i) review the declarations of candidacy filed by candidates for the State Board of
63	Education to determine if more than two candidates have filed for the same seat; and
64	(ii) if more than two candidates for the State Board of Education have filed a
65	declaration of candidacy for the same seat, send the county clerks a certified list of names of all
66	candidates that filed for the same seat for placement on the nonpartisan section of the primary
67	<u>ballot.</u>
68	(b) The county clerk shall:
69	[(a)] (i) review the declarations of candidacy filed by candidates for local boards of
70	education to determine if more than two candidates have filed for the same seat;
71	[(b)] (ii) place on the nonpartisan section of the ballot:
72	(A) the names of all candidates who have filed a declaration of candidacy for a local
73	board of education seat [on the nonpartisan section of the ballot] if more than two candidates
74	have filed for the same seat; and
75	(B) the names of the candidates for State Board of Education on the list certified by the
76	lieutenant governor under Subsection (3)(a)(ii); and
77	[(c)] (iii) determine the order of the candidates' names on the ballot in accordance with
78	Section 20A-6-305.
79	(4) After the county clerk receives the certified list from a registered political party, the
80	county clerk shall post or publish a primary election notice in substantially the following form:
81	"Notice is given that a primary election will be held Tuesday, June,
82	(year), to nominate party candidates for the parties and nonpartisan offices listed on
83	the primary ballot. The polling place for voting precinct is The polls will open at 7
84	a.m. and continue open until 8 p.m. of the same day. Attest: county clerk."
85	(5) (a) [Candidates,] (i) Except as provided by Subsection (5)(b), a candidate, other
86	than presidential candidates, receiving the highest number of votes cast for each office at the
87	regular primary election are nominated by their party or nonpartisan group for that office.
88	(ii) Except as provided by Subsection (5)(b), the two candidates for a nonpartisan
89	office who receive the highest number of votes are nominated to be candidates in the regular

- (b) If two or more candidates, other than presidential candidates, are to be elected to the office at the regular general election[-]:
- (i) those party candidates equal in number to positions to be filled who receive the highest number of votes at the regular primary election are the nominees of their party for those positions[:]; and
- (ii) the candidates for nonpartisan office, double in number to positions to be filled, who receive the highest number of votes at the regular primary election advance to the regular general election.
- (6) (a) When a tie vote occurs in any primary election for any national, state, or other office that represents more than one county, the governor, lieutenant governor, and attorney general shall, at a public meeting called by the governor and in the presence of the candidates involved, select the nominee by lot cast in whatever manner the governor determines.
- (b) When a tie vote occurs in any primary election for any county office, the district court judges of the district in which the county is located shall, at a public meeting called by the judges and in the presence of the candidates involved, select the nominee by lot cast in whatever manner the judges determine.
- (7) The expense of providing all ballots, blanks, or other supplies to be used at any primary election provided for by this section, and all expenses necessarily incurred in the preparation for or the conduct of that primary election shall be paid out of the treasury of the county or state, in the same manner as for the regular general elections.
 - Section 2. Section 20A-14-104 is amended to read:
- 20A-14-104. Becoming a candidate for membership on the State Board of Education.
- [(1) (a) Persons] A person interested in becoming a candidate for the State Board of Education shall file a declaration of candidacy according to the procedures and requirements of Sections 20A-9-201 and 20A-9-202.
- [(b) By May 1 of the year in which a State Board of Education member's term expires, the lieutenant governor shall submit the name of each person who has filed a declaration of candidacy for the State Board of Education to the nominating and recruiting committee for the State Board of Education.]

121	[(2) By November 1 of the year preceding each regular general election year, a
122	nominating and recruiting committee consisting of 12 members, each to serve a two-year term,
123	shall be appointed by the governor as follows:
124	[(a) one member shall be appointed to represent each of the following business and
125	industry sectors:]

148	schedule and convene all committee meetings.]
149	[(c) Any formal action by the committee requires the approval of a majority of

151	[(d) Members of the nominating and recruiting committee shall serve without

152	compensation, but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of their
153	official duties as established by the Division of Finance.
154	[(5) The nominating and recruiting committee shall:]
155	[(a) recruit potential candidates for membership on the State Board of Education prior
156	to the deadline to file a declaration of candidacy;]
157	[(b) prepare a list of candidates for membership on the State Board of Education for

160	[(c) submit a list of at least three candidates for each state board position to the
161	governor by July 1; and]
162	[(d) ensure that the list includes appropriate background information on each
163	candidate.]
164	[(6) The nominating committee shall select a broad variety of candidates who possess
165	outstanding professional qualifications relating to the powers and duties of the State Board of
166	Education, including experience in the following areas:
167	[(a) business and industry administration;]
168	[(b) business and industry human resource management;]
169	[(c) business and industry finance;]
170	[(d) business and industry, including expertise in:]
171	[(i) metrics and evaluation;]
172	[(ii) manufacturing;]
173	[(iii) retailing;]
174	[(iv) natural resources;]
