Mental health access study. 21 (1) The University of Utah shall conduct a comprehensive study of wait times and barriers 22 to accessing pediatric mental health care in Utah, which shall: 23 (a) measure and analyze the average time between a child's initial referral to a mental 24 health appointment and the date of the first available appointment; 25 (b) identify factors affecting wait times, including: 26 (i) geographic location; 27 (ii) insurance type; 28 (iii) provider availability; 29 (iv) specialty care needs; and
