50	(2) The commission consists of the following nine members:
51	(a) a member of the Senate that the president of the Senate appoints;
52	(b) two members of the House of Representatives that the speaker of the House of
53	Representatives appoints;
54	(c) the following three individuals that the governor appoints:
55	(i) one individual from among three proposed individuals that the state commander of
56	the Veterans of Foreign Wars recommends;

(ii) one individual from among three proposed individuals that the state commander of

the American Legion recommends; and
(iii) one individual from among three proposed individuals that the state commander of
the Disabled American Veterans recommends;
(d) the executive director of the Department of Veterans and Military Affairs or the
executive director's designee;
(e) the executive director of the State Capitol Preservation Board or the executive
director's designee; and
(f) the director of the Division of State History or the director's designee.
(3) Each individual with authority to appoint an individual under Subsection (2) shall
make the appointment before July 1, 2019.
(4) The commission shall select a chair and a vice chair from among the members
described in Subsection (2) during the commission's initial meeting.
(5) A majority of the commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction of
commission business.
(6) The commission shall ensure that each meeting of the commission complies with
Title 52, Chapter 4, Open and Public Meetings Act.
(7) The Division of State History shall provide staff support to the commission.
Section 3. Section <b>63G-1-803</b> is enacted to read:
63G-1-803. Commission vacancies Salaries and expenses.
(1) (a) The individual who appointed a commission member may remove the member
from the commission.
(b) If a commission member described in Subsection 63G-1-802(2)(a) or (b) leaves the
member's legislative office, the individual may not continue to serve as a commission member.
(c) Within 14 days after the day on which a vacancy occurs under Subsection (1)(a) or
(b) or the day on which another event occurs that causes a vacancy, the individual who
originally appointed the member to the subsequently vacant position shall fill the vacancy in
accordance with Subsection 63G-1-802(2).
(2) (a) A commission member may not receive compensation or benefits for the

87	expenses incurred as a commission member as allowed in Sections 63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107
88	and rules that the Division of Finance makes in accordance with Sections 63A-3-106 and

90	(b) Compensation and expenses of a commission member who is a legislator are
91	governed by Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Legislative Compensation and
92	Expenses.
93	Section 4. Section <b>63G-1-804</b> is enacted to read:
94	63G-1-804. Commission duties.
95	The commission shall:
96	(1) convene the commission's initial meeting on or before July 12, 2019;
97	(2) before August 1, 2019, issue a request for designs for the memorial;
98	(3) before November 1, 2019, hold at least three public hearings regarding potential
99	site options for the memorial;
100	(4) no later than the November interim meeting in 2019, make a report and
101	recommendation to the Government Operations Interim Committee regarding:
102	(a) potential site options for the memorial; and
103	(b) public input that the commission received under Subsection (3); and
104	(5) before February 1, 2020:
105	(a) hold at least three public hearings regarding potential designs for the memorial; and
106	(b) provide a formal written proposal to the House Government Operations Standing
107	Committee and the Senate Government Operations and Political Subdivisions Standing
