100	(a) "Gold medal recognition award" means recognition through a certificate the state	
101	board awards to an elementary school that meets the physical education criteria the	
102	state board establishes under this section.	
103	(b) "Program" means the Gold Medal Schools Pilot Program created in Subsection (2).	
104	(2) There is created a three-year pilot program, known as the Gold Medal Schools Pilot	
105	Program, to provide funding to an LEA to promote healthy physical lifestyle choices by	r -
106	students in schools and improve the physical education, physical activity, and nutrition	
107	of a student by:	
108	(a) encouraging a student to engage in regular physical activity;	
109	(b) promoting healthy eating habits and food choices in schools; and	
110	(c) creating school policies that support lifelong health and wellness for students.	
111	(3) The state board shall, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative	
112	Rulemaking Act, make rules to:	
113	(a) establish physical education criteria for a participating school, including criteria for	
114	earning a gold medal recognition award, that:	
115	(i) achieve the purpose of the program as described in Subsection (2); and	
116	(ii) apply alternate criteria to students with a physical limitation;	
117	(b) select 50 elementary schools, including both urban and rural elementary schools, to	
118	participate in the program for three years;	
119	(c) subject to legislative appropriations, award \$1,000 in program funds to an elementa	<u>ry</u>
120	school:	
121	(i) that meets the physical education criteria the state board establishes; and	
122	(ii) in accordance with the requirements of this section;	
123	(d) create an application process for an LEA or individual school to participate in the	
124	program;	
125	(e) establish limitations on LEA or school use of funds the LEA or school receives	
126	through the program that emphasize physical activity and healthy eating habits;	
127	(f) begin program implementation for the 2026-27 school year;	
128	(g) grant a participating LEA or school autonomy to implement the program in	
129	accordance with local needs and resources; and	
130	(h) establish a system to distribute program funds to the participating LEAs, including	<u>a</u>
131	percentage cap for an LEA's administration of the program.	
132	(4)(a) An LEA may submit an application to participate in the program.	

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133 (b) In the LEA's application, the LEA shall: 134 (i) identify an elementary school within the LEA that wishes to participate in the 135 program; (ii) describe how a participating elementary school will implement the program's 136 137 objectives; and 138 (iii) outline measurable goals aligned with the program's purpose. 139 (c) An LEA that the state board accepts to participate in the program shall, at the 140 conclusion of each school year, submit a report to the state board demonstrating 141 whether the school has met the physical education criteria the state board establishes 142 for the program. 143 (5) An LEA that participates in the program may only use program funds to achieve the 144 purposes described in Subsection (2). 145 (6) The state board may use up to 6.25% of the money appropriated for the purposes 146 described in this section for administrative costs of the state board. 147 (7) Upon request of the Education Interim Committee, the state board shall report to the 148 Education Interim Committee on: 149 (a) the implementation of the program; and 150 (b) the program's progress and health outcomes. 151 Section 3.
