	Section 1. Section 19-2-128 is enacted to read:
	19-2-128. Air Quality Policy Advisory Board created Composition
R	Responsibility Terms of office Compensation.
	(1) There is created the Air Quality Policy Advisory Board consisting of the following



28	10 voting members:
29	(a) two members of the Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate;
30	(b) three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
31	House of Representatives;
32	(c) the $\hat{H} \rightarrow [executive] \leftarrow \hat{H}$ director;
33	(d) one representative of industry interests, appointed by the president of the Senate;
34	(e) one representative of business or economic development interests, appointed by the
35	speaker of the House of Representatives, who has expertise in air quality matters;
36	(f) one representative of the academic community, appointed by the governor, who has
37	expertise in air quality matters; and
38	(g) one representative of a nongovernmental organization, appointed by the governor,
39	who:
40	(i) represents community interests;
41	(ii) does not represent industry or business interests; and
42	(iii) has expertise in air quality matters.
43	(2) The Air Quality Policy Advisory Board shall:
