32 General Description:

This bill requires the State Board of Education to provide funding to local education agencies for additional paid professional hours for educators.

59	Section 1. Section 53F-7-202 is enacted to read:		
60	53F-7-202. Paid professional hours for educators.		
61	(1) Subject to legislative appropriations, the state board shall provide funding to each		
62	LEA to provide additional paid professional hours to the following educators in accordance		
63	with this section:		
64	(a) general education and special education teachers;		
65	(b) counselors;
