LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies the Code of Criminal Procedure regarding prosecution of offenses under federal law.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

► provides that any offense committed in Utah on state or local land may not be transferred to the federal government for prosecution under the federal law often referred to as the federal hate crimes statute.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **77-2-10** is enacted to read:

77-2-10. Prohibition of prosecution of hate crimes under federal law.

Any alleged offense that is committed in Utah on state or local land may not be
