This bill authorizes a Martin Luther King, Jr. Civil Rights Support special group license
plate.

This bill:
<ul> <li>creates a Martin Luther King, Jr. Civil Rights Support special group license plate</li> </ul>
for programs that create or support civil rights awareness and education programs;
<ul> <li>requires applicants for a new plate to make a \$35 annual donation to the Martin</li> </ul>
Luther King, Jr. Civil Rights Support Restricted Account;
<ul> <li>creates the Martin Luther King, Jr. Civil Rights Support Restricted Account;</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>requires the Department of Community and Culture to distribute funds in the Martin</li> </ul>
Luther King, Jr. Civil Rights Support Restricted Account to certain organizations
that provide programs that create or support civil rights awareness and education
programs; and
<ul> <li>makes technical changes.</li> </ul>

license plate authorized in Section 41-1a-422 under this Subsection (3), the division shall
report to the Transportation Interim Committee that the division will stop the issuance on or
before the November interim meeting of the year in which the commission determines to stop
the issuance of that type of support special group license plate.

(4) (a) Beginning on July 1, 2011, if a support special group license plate type
authorized in Section 41-1a-422 and issued on or after January 1, 2012, has less than 500
license plates issued each year for a three consecutive year time period that begins on July 1,
the division may not issue that type of support special group license plate to a new applicant
beginning on January 1 of the following calendar year after the three consecutive year time
period for which that type of support special group license plate has less than 500 license plates
issued each year.

(b) If the division is required to stop the issuance of a type of support special group
license plate authorized in Section 41-1a-422 under this Subsection (4), the division shall
report to the Transportation Interim Committee that the division will stop the issuance on or
before the November interim meeting of the year in which the commission determines to stop
the issuance of that type of support special group license plate.

- (5) Beginning on July 1, 2011, the division may not issue a unique vehicle type license
  plate for a vehicle powered by clean fuel under Subsection (1)(c)(iv) to an applicant.
