General Description:
This bill supplements or reduces appropriations otherwise provided for the support and
operation of state government for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 provides appropriations for the use and support of higher education and certain state
agencies;
 provides appropriations for other purposes as described; and
provides intent language.
Money Appropriated in this Bill:
This bill appropriates \$480,410,800 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2022,
including:
• (\$824,956,100) from the General Fund;
► \$450,420,100 from the Education Fund; and
► \$854,946,800 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates (\$26,371,500) in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2022.
This bill appropriates \$105,829,100 in business-like activities for fiscal year 2022, including:
► \$8,722,800 from the General Fund; and
► \$97,106,300 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates (\$5,597,300) in restricted fund and account transfers for fiscal year
2022, including:
► (\$9,760,400) from the General Fund; and
► \$4,163,100 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$4,132,600 in transfers to unrestricted funds for fiscal year 2022.
This bill appropriates \$60,000,000 in capital project funds for fiscal year 2022, all of which is
from the Education Fund.
