General Description:
This bill supplements or reduces appropriations otherwise provided for the support and
operation of state government for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024
and appropriates funds for the support and operation of state government for the fiscal year
beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2025.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 provides appropriations for the use and support of certain state agencies;
 provides appropriations for other purposes as described;
provides intent language.
Money Appropriated in this Bill:
This bill appropriates (\$1,502,600) in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2024.
This bill appropriates \$136,908,700 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2025,
including:
► \$68,501,300 from the General Fund;
► \$1,850,000 from the Income Tax Fund; and
► \$66,557,400 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$47,580,400 in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2025.
This bill appropriates \$12,000,000 in restricted fund and account transfers for fiscal year
2025, including:
► \$12,009,500 from the General Fund; and
► (\$9,500) from various sources as detailed in this bill.
Other Special Clauses:
Section 1 of this bill takes effect immediately. Section 2 and Section 3 of this bill take effect
