55		and support for school districts, local governments, and communities on access to
56		play opportunities, learning, therapy, and youth sport that are responsive to a child's
57		developmental needs and interests;
58		(d) to gather and maintain data on childhood play, including data that measures the
59		desired outcomes as determined by the center;

61		healthy and meaningful play for all youth and the impact of play on children and
