Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 53-25-601 is enacted to read:
Part 6. Policy for Violation of Protective Orders and Injunctions
<u>53-25-601</u> . Definitions.
As used in this part:
(1) "Jail release agreement" means the same as that term is defined in Section 78B-7-801.

29	state, or an entity operated by a private institution of higher education, that exists
30	primarily to prevent and detect crime and enforce criminal laws, statutes, or ordinances.
