#### 4 General Description:

This bill addresses parent-time and custody.

#### **6 Highlighted Provisions:**

- 7 This bill:
  - addresses a change of custody or parent-time for a minor child who turns five years old;
  - modifies the parent-time requirements upon the relocation of a parent;
- 10 addresses telephone contact and virtual parent-time for a noncustodial parent when a
- 11 parent relocates;
- requires the time periods for extended parent-time by a parent for summer break or
- 13 off-track time to be consecutive;
- 14 modifies the parent-time schedules to address consistency among the schedules;
- 15 modifies the parent-time schedules for Mother's Day and Father's Day;
- 16 removes Columbus Day and Veterans Day as holidays in the parent-time schedules; and
- 17 makes technical and conforming changes.

31	Section 1. Section <b>81-9-208</b> is amended to read:
32	81-9-208. Modification or termination of a custody or parent-time order
33	Noncompliance with a parent-time order.
34	(1) The court has continuing jurisdiction to make subsequent changes to modify:
35	(a) custody of a minor child if there is a showing of a substantial and material change in
36	circumstances since the entry of the order; and
37	(b) parent-time for a minor child if there is a showing that there is a change in
38	circumstances since the entry of the order.
39	(2) A substantial and material change in circumstances under Subsection (1)(a) includes a
40	showing by a parent that the other parent:
41	(a) resides with an individual or provides an individual with access to the minor child;
42	and
43	(b) knows that the individual:
44	(i) is required to register as a sex offender[-or], a kidnap offender, or a child abuse
45	offender for an offense against a minor child under Title 77, Chapter 41, [Sex and
46	Kidnap Offender Registry] Sex, Kidnap, and Child Abuse Offender Registry; or
47	[(ii) is required to register as a child abuse offender under Title 77, Chapter 43, Child
48	Abuse Offender Registry; or]
49	[(iii)] (ii) has been convicted of:
50	(A) a child abuse offense under Section 76-5-109, 76-5-109.2, 76-5-109.3,
51	76-5-114, or 76-5-208;
52	(B) a sexual offense against a minor child under Title 76, Chapter 5, Part 4, Sexual

63	[(3)] (4) On the petition of one or both of the parents, or the joint legal or physical
64	custodians if they are not the parents, the court may, after a hearing, modify or terminate

65 an order that established joint legal custody or joint physical custody if: 66 (a) the verified petition or accompanying affidavit initially alleges that admissible 67 evidence will show that there has been a substantial and material change in the 68 circumstances of the minor child or one or both parents or joint legal or physical 69 custodians since the entry of the order to be modified; 70 (b) a modification of the terms and conditions of the order would be an improvement for 71 and in the best interest of the minor child; and 72 (c)(i) both parents have complied in good faith with the dispute resolution procedure 73 in accordance with Subsection 81-9-205(8); or 74 (ii) if no dispute resolution procedure is contained in the order that established joint 75 legal custody or joint physical custody, the court orders the parents to participate 76 in a dispute resolution procedure in accordance with Subsection 81-9-205(13) 77 unless the parents certify that, in good faith, they have used a dispute resolution 78 procedure to resolve their dispute. 79 [(4)] (5)(a) In determining whether the best interest of a minor child will be served by 80 either modifying or terminating the joint legal custody or joint physical custody 81 order, the court shall, in addition to other factors the court considers relevant, 82 consider the factors described in Sections 81-9-204 and 81-9-205. 83 (b) A court order modifying or terminating an existing joint legal custody or joint 84 physical custody order shall contain written findings that: 85 (i) a substantial and material change of circumstance has occurred; and 86 (ii) a modification of the terms and conditions of the order would be an improvement 87 for and in the best interest of the minor child. 88 (c) The court shall give substantial weight to the existing joint legal custody or joint 89 physical custody order when the minor child is thriving, happy, and well-adjusted. 90 [(5)] (6) The court shall, in every case regarding a petition for termination of a joint legal 91 custody or joint physical custody order, consider reasonable alternatives to preserve the 92 existing order in accordance with Section 81-9-204. 93 [(6)] (7) The court may modify the terms and conditions of the existing order in accordance 94 with this chapter and may order the parents to file a parenting plan in accordance with 95 Section 81-9-203. 96 [<del>(7)</del>] (8) A parent requesting a modification from sole custody to joint legal custody or joint

physical custody or both, or any other type of shared parenting arrangement, shall file

101	deployment of one or both parents who are service members, and the service member				
102	has not yet been notified of deployment, the court shall resolve the issue based on the				
103	standards in Sections 78B-20-306 through 78B-20-309.				
104	[(9)] (10) If the court finds that an action to modify custody or parent-time is filed or				
105	answered frivolously and, in a manner, designed to harass the other party, the court shall				
106	assess attorney fees as costs against the offending party.				
107	[(10)] (11) If a petition to modify custody or parent-time provisions of a court order is made				
108	and denied, the court shall order the petitioner to pay the reasonable attorney fees

128	81-9-209 . Notice of relocation Effect of relocation on parent-time schedule.				
129	(1) As used in this section, "relocation" means moving 150 miles or more from the				
130	residence of the other parent.				
131	(2) The relocating parent shall provide written notice to the other parent at least 60 days				
132	before the day on which the relocating parent intends to relocate.				

133	(3) The written notice of relocation [under] described in Subsection (2) shall contain
134	statements affirming[-]:
135	(a) the parent-time provisions in Subsection (9) or a parent-time schedule approved by
136	both parties will be followed; and
137	(b) that a parent will not interfere with the other's parental rights pursuant to court
138	ordered parent-time arrangements or the parent-time schedule approved by both
139	parties.
140	(4) [The] Upon a motion of any party or upon the court's own motion, the court shall[, upon
141	motion of any party or upon the court's own motion,] schedule a hearing with notice to:
142	(a) review the notice of relocation and the relevant parent-time schedule under Section
143	81-8-302 or 81-8-304; and
144	(b) make appropriate orders regarding the parent-time schedule and costs for
145	parent-time transportation.
146	(5) In a hearing to review the notice of relocation, the court shall, in determining if the
147	relocation of a custodial parent is in the best interest of the minor child, consider any
148	other factors that the court considers relevant to the determination.
149	(6) If the court determines that relocation is not in the best interest of the minor child, and
150	the custodial parent relocates, the court may order a change of custody.
151	(7)(a) If the court finds that the relocation is in the best interest of the minor child, the
152	court shall determine the parent-time schedule and allocate the transportation costs
153	that will be incurred for the minor child to visit the noncustodial parent.
154	(b) In making a determination under Subsection (7)(a), the court shall consider:
155	(i) the reason for the parent's relocation;
156	(ii) the additional costs or difficulty to both parents in exercising parent-time;
157	(iii) the economic resources of both parents; and
158	(iv) other factors the court considers necessary and relevant.
159	(8) If a parent relocates because of an act of domestic violence or family violence by the
160	other parent, the court shall make specific findings and orders with regard to the
161	application of this section.
162	(9) Unless otherwise ordered by the court, <u>and</u> upon the relocation of one of the parties, the
163	following schedule is the minimum parent-time that the noncustodial parent is entitled to
164	a minor child who is five to 18 years old:
165	(a) in years ending in an odd number, the minor child shall spend the following holidays

with the noncustodial parent:

167	[(i) Thanksgiving holiday beginning Wednesday until Sunday; and]
168	[(ii) Spring break, if applicable, beginning the last day of school before the holiday
169	until the day before school resumes;]
170	(i)(A) fall break if the minor child's school dismisses for a fall break, beginning on
171	the day that school dismisses for fall break and ending on the day before school
172	resumes; or
173	(B) Labor Day if the minor child's school does not dismiss for a fall break,
174	beginning on the day that school dismisses for Labor Day and ending on the
175	day before school resumes; and
176	(ii) the entire winter break period, beginning on the day that school dismisses for the
177	winter break and ending on the day before school resumes;
178	(b) in years ending in an even number, the minor child shall spend the following
179	holidays with the noncustodial parent:
180	[(i) the entire winter school break period; and]
181	[(ii) the Fall school break beginning the last day of school before the holiday until the
182	day before school resumes;]
183	(i)(A) spring break, beginning on the day that school dismisses for the spring
184	break and ending on the day before school resumes; or
185	(B) President's Day if the minor child's school does not dismiss for a spring break
186	beginning on the day that school dismisses for President's Day and ending on
187	the day before school resumes; and
188	(ii) Thanksgiving, beginning on the day that school dismisses for Thanksgiving and
189	ending on the day before school resumes;
190	(c) extended parent-time equal to 1/2 of the summer or off-track time for consecutive
191	weeks_with:
192	(i) the noncustodial parent entitled to the first 1/2 of the summer or off-track time in
193	years ending in an odd number; and
194	(ii) the noncustodial parent entitled to the second 1/2 of the summer or off-track time
195	in years ending in an even number; and
196	(d) one weekend per month, at the option and expense of the noncustodial parent.
197	(10) For extended parent-time [under] described in Subsection (9)(c), the [minor child
198	should be returned] noncustodial parent shall return the minor child to the custodial home
199	no later than seven days before school begins, except that this week is counted when
200	determining the amount of parent-time to be divided between the parents for the summer

201	or off-track period.
202	(11)(a) [The] Upon relocation of one of parties, the court may [also-]set a parent-time
203	schedule for a minor child who is younger than five years old.
204	(b) The schedule shall take into consideration the following:
205	(i) the age of the minor child;
206	(ii) the developmental needs of the minor child;
207	(iii) the distance between the parents' homes;
208	(iv) the travel arrangements and cost;
209	(v) the level of attachment between the minor child and the noncustodial parent; and
210	(vi) any other factors relevant to the best interest of the minor child.
211	[(12) The noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement is subject to the following
212	restrictions.]
213	[ <del>(a)</del> ]
214	[(i)] (12)(a)(i) If the noncustodial parent has not designated a specific weekend [for
215	parent-time] on which the noncustodial parent will exercise parent-time under
216	Subsection (9)(d), the noncustodial parent shall receive the last weekend of each
217	month[-unless a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on that particular
218	weekend].
219	(ii) If a holiday assigned to the custodial parent falls on [the last weekend of the
220	month] a weekend on which the noncustodial parent normally exercises
221	parent-time under Subsection (9)(d), the noncustodial parent is entitled to the [
222	next to the last weekend of the month] week before the holiday.
223	(b) If a noncustodial parent's extended parent-time or parent-time over a holiday extends
224	into or through the first weekend of the next month, that weekend shall be considered
225	the noncustodial parent's monthly weekend entitlement under Subsection (9)(d) for
226	that month.
227	(c) If a minor child is out of school for teacher development days or snow days after the
228	minor child begins the school year, or other days not included in the list of holidays
229	in Subsection (9), and those days are contiguous with the noncustodial parent's
230	monthly weekend or holiday parent-time, those days shall be included in the
231	noncustodial parent's weekend or holiday parent-time.
232	(13)(a) In addition to the parent-time for which a noncustodial parent is entitled under
233	Subsection (9), the noncustodial parent is entitled to, at least two times a week:
234	(i) brief telephone contact with the minor child at reasonable hours and for a

235	reasonable duration; and					
236	(ii) virtual parent-time if the equipment is reasonably available at reasonable hours					
237	and for reasonable duration.					
238	(b) If the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the					
239	court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably					
240	available, taking into consideration:					
241	(i) the best interests of the minor child;					
242	(ii) each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and					
243	(iii) any other factors the court considers material.					
244	(c) Virtual parent-time supplements, but does not replace, the in-person parent-time					
245	described in Subsection (9).					
246	[(13)] (14) The custodial parent is entitled to all parent-time not specifically allocated to the					
247	noncustodial parent.					
248	[(14)] (15) In the event finances and distance preclude the exercise of minimum parent-time					
249	for the noncustodial parent during the school year, the court should consider awarding					
250	more time for the noncustodial parent during the summer time if it is in the best interests					
251	of the [the-]minor child.					
252	[(15)] (16)(a) Upon the motion of any party, the court may order uninterrupted					
253	parent-time with the noncustodial parent for a minimum of 30 days during extended					
254	parent-time, unless the court finds it is not in the best interest of the minor child.					
255	(b) If the court orders uninterrupted parent-time during a period not covered by this					
256	section, the court shall specify in its order which parent is responsible for the minor					
257	child's travel expenses.					
258	[(16)] (17)(a) Unless otherwise ordered by the court the relocating party shall be					
259	responsible for all the minor child's travel expenses relating to Subsections (9)(a) and					
260	(b) and 1/2 of the minor child's travel expenses relating to Subsection (9)(c), provided					
261	the noncustodial parent is current on all support obligations.					
262	(b) If the noncustodial parent has been found in contempt for not being current on all					
263	support obligations, the noncustodial parent is responsible for all of the minor child's					
264	travel expenses under Subsection (9), unless the court rules otherwise.					
265	(c) A responsible party shall make a reimbursement to the other for the minor child's					
266	travel expenses within 30 days of receipt of documents detailing those expenses.					
267	[(17)] (18) The court may apply this provision to any preexisting decree of divorce.					
268	[(18)] (19) Any action under this section may be set for an expedited hearing.					

269	[(19)] (20) A parent who fails to comply with the notice of relocation in Subsection (2) is in
270	contempt of the court's order.
271	Section 3. Section 81-9-302 is amended to read:
272	81-9-302. Minimum schedule for parent-time for a minor child five to 18 years
273	old.
274	(1) The parent-time schedule in this section applies to a minor child who is five to 18 years
275	old.
276	(2) If the parties do not agree to a parent-time schedule for a minor child described in
277	Subsection (1), the following schedule is considered the minimum parent-time to which
278	the noncustodial parent is entitled to the minor child:
279	(a)(i) one weekday evening to be specified by the noncustodial parent or the court or
280	Wednesday evening if not specified, beginning at 5:30 p.m. and ending at 8:30
281	p.m.; or
282	(ii) at the election of the noncustodial parent, one weekday to be specified by the
283	noncustodial parent or the court:
284	(A) beginning at the time that the minor child's school is regularly dismissed and
285	ending at 8:30 p.m.; or
286	(B) if school is not in session, the noncustodial parent is available to be with the
287	minor child, and in accommodation with the custodial parent's work schedule,
288	beginning at [9] 8 a.m. and ending at 8:30 p.m.;
289	(b)(i) beginning on the first weekend after entry of the decree, alternating weekends
290	beginning at [6] 5:30 p.m. on Friday and ending on Sunday at [7] 8:30 p.m.; or
291	(ii) at the election of the noncustodial parent and beginning on the first weekend after
292	the entry of the decree, alternating weekends:
293	(A) beginning at the time that the minor child's school is regularly dismissed on
294	Friday and ending on Sunday at [7] 8:30 p.m.; or
295	(B) if school is not in session, the noncustodial parent is available to be with the
296	minor child, and in accommodation with the custodial parent's work schedule,
297	beginning on Friday at [9] $\underline{8}$ a.m. and ending on Sunday at [7] $\underline{8:30}$ p.m.;
298	(c) each holiday granted to the noncustodial parent in accordance with the holiday
299	schedule described in Subsection (12); and
300	(d) extended parent-time with the minor child when school is not in session for summer
301	break in accordance with Subsection (3).
302	(3)(a) For extended parent-time with the minor child [under] described in Subsection

303	(2)(d) and at the election of the noncustodial parent, the noncustodial parent is			
304	entitled up to four weeks of parent-time with the minor child[, which may be			
305	consecutive,] when school is not in session for summer break, beginning at 8 a.m. on			
306	the first day and ending at 8:30 p.m. on the last day.			
307	(b) For the four weeks of extended parent-time for a noncustodial parent under			
308	Subsection (3)(a):			
309	(i) two weeks[, which may be consecutive,] shall be uninterrupted parent-time for the			
310	noncustodial parent; and			
311	(ii) two weeks[, which may be consecutive,] may be interrupted by the custodial			
312	parent for a weekday visit on the same day on which the noncustodial parent is			
313	granted weekday day parent-time.			
314	(c) A custodial parent is entitled to uninterrupted parent-time with the minor child for			
315	two weeks[, which may be consecutive,] when school is not in session for summer			
316	break, beginning at 8 a.m. on the first day and ending at 8:30 p.m. on the last day.			
317	(d) Extended parent-time described in this Subsection (3) must be consecutive, except			
318	that the four weeks of extended parent-time for the noncustodial parent may be			
319	divided into two separate 14-day periods that are not consecutive.			
320	(4)(a) Each parent shall provide notification to the other parent of the parent's plans for			
321	the exercise of extended parent-time for summer break under Subsection (3).			
322	(b) For the notification requirement [under] described in Subsection (4)(a):			
323	(i) in odd-numbered years:			
324	(A) the noncustodial parent shall provide notice to the custodial parent by May 1;			
325	and			
326	(B) the custodial parent shall provide notice to the noncustodial parent by May 15			
327	and			
328	(ii) in even-numbered years:			
329	(A) the custodial parent shall provide notice to the noncustodial parent by May 1;			
330	and			
331	(B) the noncustodial parent shall provide notice to the custodial parent by May 15			
332	(c)(i) If a parent fails to provide a notification within the time periods described in			
333	Subsection (4)(b), the complying parent may determine the schedule for summer			
334	break for the noncomplying parent.			
335	(ii) If both parents fail to provide notice within the time periods described in			
336	Subsection (4)(b), the first parent to provide notice may determine the schedule			

337 for summer break for that parent and the other parent. 338 (d) If a custodial parent intends to interrupt a noncustodial parent's parent-time under 339 Subsection (3)(b)(ii), the custodial parent shall provide notification to the 340 noncustodial parent of the intent to interrupt parent-time within 10 days after the day 341 on which the custodial parent receives notification of the noncustodial parent's plans 342 for the exercise of interrupted extended parent-time. 343 (5)(a) An election should be made by the noncustodial parent at the time of entry of the 344 divorce decree or court order, except that the election may be changed by mutual 345 agreement, court order, or by the noncustodial parent in the event of a change in the 346 minor child's schedule. 347 (b) An election by either parent concerning parent-time shall be made a part of the 348 decree and made a part of the parent-time order. 349 (6)(a) Changes may not be made to the parent-time schedule under this section, except 350 that if a conflict arises in the parent-time schedule, the following order of precedence 351 shall be applied when determining which parent is entitled to parent-time: 352 (i) the holiday schedule for Mother's Day or Father's Day under Subsection (12); 353 (ii) the holiday schedule for the minor child's birthday, unless a parent is exercising 354 uninterrupted extended parent-time under Subsection (3) and takes the minor child 355 away from that parent's residence during the uninterrupted extended parent-time; 356 (iii) the holiday schedule for any holiday under Subsection (12) that is not Father's 357 Day, Mother's Day, or the minor child's birthday; 358 (iv) extended parent-time under Subsection (3); and 359 (v) the schedule for weekday or weekend parent-time. 360 (b) A parent exercising parent-time for the minor child's birthday may bring other 361 siblings along for the minor child's birthday. 362 (7) A stepparent, grandparent, or other responsible adult designated by [the noncustodial] a 363 parent, may pick up the minor child for parent-time if the [eustodial] other parent is 364 aware of the identity of the individual and the [noncustodial] parent will be with the 365 minor child by 7 p.m. 366 (8) If a holiday falls on a regularly scheduled school day, the parent exercising parent-time 367 shall be responsible for the minor child's attendance at school for that school day. 368 (9) If there is more than one minor child and the minor children's school schedules vary for 369 purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's 370 half of the holiday, the minor children may remain together for the holiday period

beginning the first evening that all minor children's schools are dismissed for the holiday and ending the evening before any minor child returns to school.

- (10)(a) Telephone contact shall be at reasonable hours and for a reasonable duration.
  - (b)(i) Virtual parent-time, if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents reside at least 100 miles apart, shall be at reasonable hours and for reasonable duration.
    - (ii) If the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably available, taking into consideration:
      - (A) the best interests of the minor child;

- (B) each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and
- (C) any other factors the court considers material.
- (c) Virtual parent-time supplements, but does not replace, in-person parent-time.
- (11) If there is a minor child five to 18 years old and a minor child under five years old and both minor children are the children of the parties, the parents and the court should consider an upward deviation for parent-time with all the minor children so that parent-time is uniform based on a schedule under this section.
- (12) The following table is the holiday schedule for parent-time under this section.
