Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
WHEREAS, in the darkest hours of World War II, when the men left to defend liberty
overseas, it was the skill and perseverance of women willing to take their places in the factories
that fueled the successful war effort;
WHEREAS, Eleanor Roosevelt once stated, "my message to women is to get in the
game and stay in the game";

WHEREAS, currently, the number of women working in nontraditional occupations is

28	relatively small, and the need for trained, skilled workers is becoming nearly epidemic;
29	WHEREAS, there is much to be done to help women attain and retain high wage, high
30	skilled careers;
31	WHEREAS, women should be given educational opportunities to enable them to
32	exercise the option of choosing nontraditional occupations to provide for themselves and their
33	families;
34	WHEREAS, nontraditional occupations provide women greater latitude in career
35	choices, which increases the likelihood that they will find a career that best suits their needs;
36	WHEREAS, opening up nontraditional occupations to more women levels the playing
37	field to well-paying, in-demand jobs;
38	WHEREAS, well-trained people achieve respect for their work and increased
39	opportunities for financial independence, security, and success;
40	WHEREAS, confidence and productivity, combined with smart life choices, greatly
41	improves a woman's chances for a solid financial foundation;
42	WHEREAS, founded in 2010, Utah Women In Trades (UWIT) is an all-volunteer
43	organization that has established itself as a group of industry experts who facilitate connections
44	between the working woman, the "wanting-to-be-working" woman, prospective employers, and
45	government agencies;
46	WHEREAS, UWIT's mission is to retain and increase the number of women seeking
47	and obtaining opportunities in nontraditional building and construction trades;
48	WHEREAS, UWIT mentors women who are new to nontraditional occupations,
49	celebrating successes and providing encouragement and hope for future generations; and
50	WHEREAS, through the efforts of UWIT and women who persist in pursuing
51	nontraditional occupations, more and more women will find the financial security and success
52	they seek for themselves and their families:
53	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah
54	expresses its support for women who choose nontraditional occupations as a way to meet the
55	challenge of supporting themselves and their families.
