

## Department of Planning and Budget 2024 Session Fiscal Impact Statement

1. **Bill Number:** SB325

2. **Patron:** Roem

3. **Committee:** Education and Health

4. **Title:** Vital records; birth certificates; adoption; members of the military.

5. **Summary:** Directs the State Registrar to issue a new birth certificate no later than two business days after receipt of adoption records for a person born in the Commonwealth if at least one adoptive parent is an active duty or retired member of the military or military reserves. The bill directs the court decreeing the adoption to deliver such records to the State Registrar no later than five business days from such decree.

6. **Budget Amendment Necessary:** See item 8.

7. **Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate.

8. **Fiscal Implications:** The provisions of the legislation require the State Registrar to issue a new certificate of birth no later than two business days upon receipt of such decree from the clerk of the court. In FY2023, the Office of Vital Records established approximately 1,974 new birth certificates as a result of the adoption of a registrant born in the Commonwealth. The number of new birth certificates established for registrants with at least one adoptive parent that is an active duty or retired member of the military or military services as per the legislation is unknown. Therefore, the total fiscal impact cannot be determined. However, VDH maintains that if the provisions of the bill lead to an appreciable increase in the number of certificates of birth to be issued within two business days, then additional support would be needed. VDH estimates that one position with a salary and fringe benefits of \$83,463 would be sufficient to process the expedited records.

11. **Other Comments:** HB649, introduced by Delegate Coyner, is a companion bill.
