| 14 | Sec. 1. FAMILY FORENSIC EVALUATOR RECOMMENDATIONS                                 |
| 15 | (a) Family forensic evaluators are mental health professionals who conduct        |
| 16 | evaluations for the purposes of providing information to attorneys, judges, and   |
| 17 | state agencies in child welfare and parenting matters. Such evaluators are an     |
| 18 | important resource in the Family Division of the Superior Court in complex        |

cases involving parental rights and responsibilities. A current lack of such

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| 2  | matters before the court in a manner that serves the best interests of children. |
| 3  | (b) The General Assembly requests that the Chief Superior Judge, the             |

| 5  | of the Vermont Psychological Association work collaboratively to examine the     |

| 7  | (1) the extent of the need for and geographic distribution of family             |
| 8  | forensic evaluators in complex parental rights and responsibilities cases heard  |

| 10 | (2) barriers to increasing the availability of family forensic evaluators in     |
| 11 | Vermont and whether protections regarding ethical complaints are warranted;      |

| 15 | (c) The General Assembly requests that the parties listed in subsection (b)      |
| 16 | of this section submit their recommendations to the General Assembly on or       |
| 17 | before November 1, 2025.   |
