8	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to prohibit junior operators from
9	operating between the hours of midnight and 5:00 a.m. for the first year

13	operating under a learner's permit from operating between the hours of

17	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

1 Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 614 is amended to read:

## § 614. RIGHTS UNDER LICENSE

(a) An operator's license shall entitle the holder to operate a registered
motor vehicle with the consent of the owner whether employed to do so or not.
A junior operator's license shall entitle the holder to operate a registered motor
vehicle, with the consent of the owner, but shall not entitle him or her to
operate a motor vehicle in the course of his or her employment or for direct or
indirect compensation for one year following issuance of the license. A junior
operator's license shall not entitle the holder to carry passengers for hire.
During the first three months of operation, the holder of a junior operator's
license is restricted to driving alone or with a licensed parent or guardian,
licensed or certified driver education instructor, or licensed person at least 25
years of age. During the following three months, a junior operator may
additionally transport family members. No person operating with a junior
operator's license shall transport more passengers than there are safety belts
unless he or she is operating a vehicle that has not been manufactured with a
federally approved safety belt system During the first year of operation, a
junior operator shall not operate a motor vehicle between 12 midnight and
5:00 a.m. except when the operator is traveling on a direct route between work
and home, or traveling for a school-related activity.

(b) This section shall not prohibit a holder of a junior operator's license		
from operating a farm tractor with or without compensation upon a public		
highway in going to and from different parts of a farm of the owner of such		
tractor and for repair purposes to any repair shop.		
(c) No person operating with a junior operator's license shall transport		
more passengers than there are safety belts unless he or she is operating a		
vehicle that has not been manufactured with a federally approved safety belt		
system.		
(d) A person in violation of subsection (a) of this section shall be allowed		
to drive home, on a direct route, following issuance of a traffic ticket by a law		
enforcement officer, and shall be subject to the penalties prescribed in section		
678 of this title.

§ 615. UNLICENSED OPERATORS		
(a)(1) An unlicensed person 15 years of age or older, may operate a motor		
vehicle, if he or she has in possession, a valid learner's permit issued to him or		
her by the commissioner and if their his or her licensed parent or guardian,		
licensed or certified driver education instructor, or licensed person at least 25		
years of age rides beside him or her. <u>However, an unlicensed person under age</u>		
18 operating under a learner's permit shall not operate a motor vehicle under		

any circumstances between 12 midnight and 5:00 a.m. Nothing in this section

shall be construed to permit a person against whom a revocation or suspension
of license is in force, or a person less than 15 years of age, or a person who has
been refused a license by the commissioner, to operate a motor vehicle.

- (2) A licensed person who does not possess a valid motorcycle endorsement may operate a motorcycle, with no passengers, only during daylight hours and then only if he or she has upon his or her person a valid motorcycle learner's permit issued to him or her by the commissioner.
- (b) The commissioner, in his or her discretion, may recall a learner's permit in the same circumstances as he or she may recall a provisional license A person in violation of subsection (a) of this section shall be allowed to drive home, on a direct route, following issuance of a traffic ticket by a law enforcement officer, and shall be subject to the penalties prescribed in section 678 of this title.

- 15 § 678. UNAUTHORIZED OPERATION

A person who may operate a motor vehicle by virtue of either a learner's permit or junior operator's license who is convicted of operating a motor vehicle while unaccompanied in violation of subsection 614(a) or 615(a) of this title shall be subject to a penalty of not more than \$50.00 and his or her learner's permit or junior operator's license shall be recalled for a period of 90 days. No person may be issued traffic complaints alleging a violation of this

- 2 provisions of this section may be enforced only if a law enforcement officer
- 3 has detained the operator of a motor vehicle for a suspected violation of
