16 Subject: Conservation; beverage container; bottle bill; nondairy beverages

17 Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to expand the scope of the beverage

18 container deposit law to include wine and all nonalcoholic carbonated or

19 noncarbonated drinks, except for unflavored rice milk, unflavored soy milk,

20 milk, and dairy-derived products.

1 An act relating to expanding the scope of the bottle bill

2 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

3 Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. § 1521(1) is amended to read:

4 (1) “Beverage” means beer or other malt beverages and mineral waters,
5 mixed wine drink, wine, spirits, soda water ~~and,~~ carbonated soft drinks,
6 noncarbonated water, and all nonalcoholic carbonated or noncarbonated drinks
7 in liquid form and intended for human consumption, except for unflavored rice
8 milk, unflavored soy milk, milk, and dairy-derived products. As of January 1,
9 1990, “beverage” also shall mean liquor.
