Subject: Motor vehicles; consumer protection; Lemon Law; Motor Vehicle
Arbitration Board; repurchase by manufacturer; reasonable allowance
for use; prorated refund

Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to amend the
formula for the reasonable allowance for use that is applicable when the
manufacturer is required to accept return of a zero-emission vehicle (ZEV) that
is unable to be conformed to any express warranty under Vermont's New
Motor Vehicle Arbitration, 9 V.S.A. chapter 115, also known as Vermont's
Lemon Law, to increase the mileage portion of the formula for the reasonable
allowance for use, currently 100,000 miles, to align with the 150,000 miles
durability requirement in the California Code of Regulations, which has been
adopted as part of Department of Environmental Conservation, Chapter 40:
Vermont Low Emission Vehicle and Zero Emission Vehicle Rules (CVR 12-
030-040).
