Subject: Conservation and development; appropriations; schools; remediation;
polychlorinated biphenyls

Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require that
the State of Vermont pay all costs that a public school will incur when
remediation, mitigation, reconstruction, or new construction of a public school
is required after testing by the Agency of Natural Resources indicates levels of
polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) at the public school in excess of the State
school action level. The bill would propose that all public schools tested by

1 ANR for PCBs after 2015 would be eligible for funding or reimbursement of
2 remediation, mitigation, reconstruction, or construction costs. The bill would
3 define “public school” as the term is defined in 16 V.S.A. § 11.
