9	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to introduce new
10	processes to handle allegations and occurrences of ethical misconduct by
11	Executive Branch officials. If an Executive Branch official is accused of
12	ethical misconduct, such as discrimination, sexual harassment, retaliation, or
13	conflicts of interest, the bill would allow the Vermont State Ethics
14	Commission to receive complaints, initiate investigations and fact-finding,
15	appoint special counsel and make referrals to outside investigators, hold
16	hearings, and recommend actions to be taken, as permitted under the Vermont
17	Constitution, including facilitated mediation, additional training and education,
18	referrals to counseling and wellness support, or other remedial actions. The
19	bill would require the State Ethics Commission's processes to consider the
20	degree of misconduct, timelines, and the privacy, rights, and responsibility of
21	the parties.
